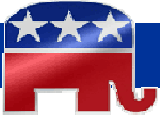


How Did You Become a Republican?

RON KNECHT



Ron Knecht is an economist, financial and policy analyst, professional mechanical engineer (registered in California) and law-school graduate who became Nevada State Controller January 5, 2015. As Controller, he also serves on Nevada's Board of Finance, Executive Branch Audit Committee and

Department of Transportation Board of Directors.

In his first full fiscal year as Controller, Ron and his management team cut spending 13 percent from the levels authorized by the Legislature and Governor based on the budget request of his predecessor. While returning over \$1 million to the State treasury, they added innovations to the work of the office including award-winning publications of Nevada's first two Popular Annual Financial Reports.

Before becoming Controller, he divided 44 working years between public service and entrepreneurial small business – all in managerial/executive and senior professional positions.

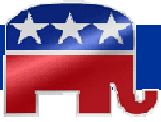
- In 2012-2014, 1986-2001 and 1976-1978, he was a consultant and business executive.
- In 2009-2013 he co-taught many two-day seminars for SNL Financial on utility finance, cost of capital, and economic and policy issues for regulators, professionals, managers and securities analysts.
- In 2001-2012, he was a senior economist at Nevada's Public Utilities Commission.
- In 1978-1986 he held principal economics, finance, policy and technology positions at California's Energy and Public Utilities Commissions.
- In 1973-1977, he was a Research Associate and Research Engineer at the University of Illinois.
- In 1972-73 he was Assistant City Engineer in Urbana, Illinois.

Ron was elected to the Board of Regents of the Nevada System of Higher Education in 2006 and re-elected in 2012. For two years, he chaired the Budget and Finance Committee and was Vice-chair another year. He chaired the Audit Committee for two years; and for seven years Ron was very active on the Investment and Major Projects Committee, which oversees \$1-billion of endowment and operating funds. He served on four other committees and on institutional presidential selection and performance-review committees, chairing two of them.

Ron was elected to the Nevada Assembly for 2002-04, representing Carson City and Washoe City. With some scholarship support, he worked his way through undergraduate and early graduate studies at Illinois (BA, Liberal Arts and Sciences; mathematics major; physics and chemistry minor; 1971). Spending most of his working career in San Francisco and Silicon Valley, he paid his way at Stanford (MS, Engineering Economic Systems, 1989) and the University of San Francisco (JD, 1995) working full time.

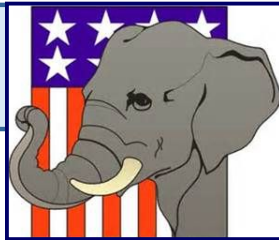
The most important things in Ron's life are his wife Kathy, their teenage daughter Karyn, and Ron and Kathy's mothers and families. Raised in a small town in the Midwest, he was active in athletics and outdoor activities and was a competitive distance runner in high school and college. Ron enjoys ballet, modern dance, symphony, opera, rock and roll, country and western, theater and film, and as a hobby, he collects baseball cards.

The Nevada State Controller is one of six Constitutional Officers of the State of Nevada and is elected to a four-year term. The Controller is the Chief Fiscal Officer (CFO) of the State of Nevada and is responsible for administering the state's accounting system, settling all claims against the state and collecting debts owed to the state. The Controller processes and records the state's financial transactions, conducts the final audit and ensures compliance with The Constitution, federal laws and state statutes. The Controller also provides the citizens, state agencies, local governments and legislators with accurate and impartial financial information. Nevada's State Controller protects the citizens' money by ensuring at all times that it is properly accounted for and spent in the most efficient and cost effective manner.



Why I am A Republican

There are many issues on which Democrats and Republican differ. One area in which I believe Republicans are on the right side is how education should be delivered.

Initially when our country was expanding, most education was delivered at the local, county level, resulting in a close relationship between teachers and the public. Schools were small and community members had to dig into their pockets to fund the buildings, the books and the teachers. As a result, parents were more involved.

Over time it became apparent that some county areas were unable to provide schooling equal to the education provided by other areas. Reasons such as money and race were key factors in this inequality. As a result, delivery of education became more centralized beginning with counties, then states, and then the federal government. Teaching, initially considered a vocation, became a profession where people were underpaid. This resulted in unions being formed to increase the pay and benefits. With education mandated by the government and delivered by people with the power to strike, a disconnect developed where the education system now was more about the teachers than students. These results contributed to a declining public educational system.

In general, Republicans favor charter schools as an alternative and as a competitor to the union-controlled public school system. Parents who desire a better education for their children also favor charter schools. Most charter schools have waiting lists, are able to find nonunion teachers and are held accountable to donors and parents for improved performance from the students. Rules are set down and abided by. Data provided by the press, think-tanks and the Department of Education shows that charter schools outperform conventional public schools in most areas that can be measured. The result is better education.

Nevertheless, Democrats, to keep a voting bloc made up of public school unions, try in any way they can to

stymie the expansion of charter schools. Why? It makes no sense to me. After all, the success of our country depends on having educated and informed citizens.

Another year has passed and again it is time to renew your

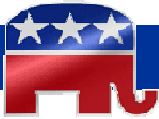

The Hidden Agenda Behind “Climate Change”

In a remarkably frank admission that laid bare the stealth agenda behind global warming alarmism, Christiana Figueres, Executive Secretary of the UN’s Framework Convention on Climate Change, admitted during a February 2015 press conference in Brussels that the UN’s real purpose in creating climate fear is to end capitalism throughout the world:

This is the first time in human history that we are setting ourselves the task of intentionally changing [getting rid of] the economic development model that has reigned since the Industrial Revolution.

The economic model to which she referred is free-market capitalism. A year earlier, Figueres revealed what capitalism must be replaced with when she bitterly complained that America’s two-party constitutional system is hampering the UN’s global climate objectives. She went on to cite China’s communist system as the kind of government America must have if the UN is to do as it pleases. In other words, for the UN to have its way, America must be transformed into a communist nation.

Let that one sink in for a moment.

Figueres is not alone. Another high-level UN Marxist had comments of his own about the hidden agenda behind “climate change.” If you’re among those who gullibly believe progressives when they say all they’re trying to do is save the planet, what Dr. Ottmar Edenhofer had to say will leave your jaw on the floor.

Is Global Warming or Change for Real?

In an unguarded statement that found its way into the public domain, Edenhofer, co-chair of the UN IPCC’s Working Group III, made this shocking admission on November 14, 2010:

One must free oneself from the illusion that international climate policy is environmental policy. [What we’re doing] has almost nothing to do with the climate. We must state clearly that we use climate policy to redistribute de facto the world’s wealth.

On the same date, Edenhofer added this . . .

Climate policy has almost nothing to do anymore with protecting the environment. The next world climate summit in Cancun is actually an economy summit during which [re]distribution of the world’s resources will be negotiated.

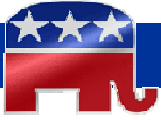
Dr. Ottmar Edenhofer, one of the UN’s top climate officials, effectively admitted that the organization’s public position on global warming is a hoax, and another senior UN official, Christiana Figueres, said in an official capacity that the United States must have a communist government for the UN to achieve its objectives.

. . . Let all of that sink in for a moment!

Some powerful elites in this country believe it’s not fair that billions of people in the world sleep on the ground in mud huts, while Americans sleep on soft mattresses in air-conditioned comfort. The progressive elites who feel that way also believe that a significantly greater portion of America’s wealth must therefore be shared or redistributed to poor nations. Global wealth redistribution is the foremost tenet of communism, and those who advocate it are, by definition, *communists*, whether they are open about it or not.

The stunning pronouncements by Figueres and Edenhofer are evidence that climate alarmism is being used as a Trojan horse to justify the massive new carbon taxes clamored for by powerful progressives like Barack Obama, Al Gore, John Kerry and Hillary Clinton, none

of whom have denounced the anti-American sentiments of two of the UN's top climate officials.

The words of one of those officials revealed that such taxes would be used not for environmental purposes, but to fund the most massive redistribution of wealth in the history of the world, literally trillions of dollars extracted under false pretenses from U.S. taxpayers, and given to the corrupt governments of every undeveloped nation on Earth, all in the guise of "climate aid."

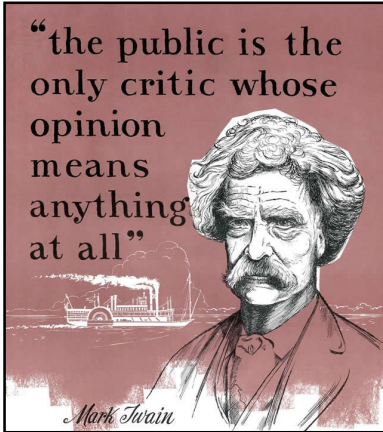

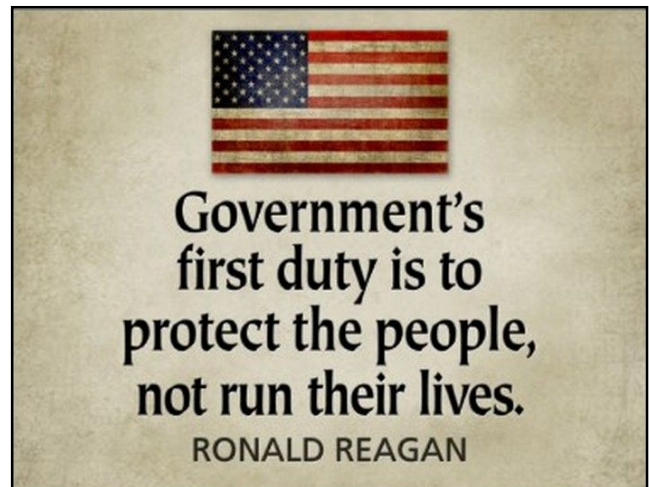
capitalism? It's not really because they are committed Marxists/ideologues. In my opinion, Marxism is just an excuse, a cover for what they really want, which is the power to decide who gets what materially in the entire society.

One of the most important things that distinguishes capitalism from all other economic systems in human history is the fact that it distributes resources and rewards by persuasion rather than coercion. Under non-capitalist systems or systems that mix capitalism and non-capitalism, prices and/or products are determined by past practice or government fiat, both of which are forms of coercion. Under capitalism, people get and keep jobs in the private sector if and because they contribute value to the business (in other words, by helping produce products and services that people freely choose to buy). What they earn is related to the value they add; and the money they are paid comes from voluntary purchases by their customers. The money they are paid comes from taxes that citizens are forced to pay. (Persuasion vs. coercion again!)

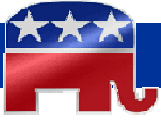
The bottom line is that the global warming alarmists want to replace persuasion in our society by coercion, and they want to be the ones doing the coercing!

The story of human economic history up until capitalism was an endless struggle over a finite amount of wealth. About Herbert Hoover

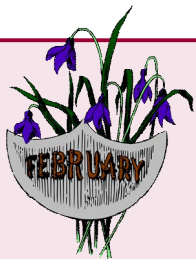


31st President of the United States

Herbert Clark Hoover was an American engineer, businessman and politician who served as the 31st President of the United States from 1929 to 1933 during the Great Depression.

A Republican, as Secretary of Commerce in the 1920s he introduced Progressive Era themes of efficiency in the business community and provided government support for standardization, efficiency and international trade. As president from 1929 to 1933, his ambitious programs were overwhelmed by the Great Depression, which seemed to get worse every year because of his insistence on immediately paying for the increasingly large-scale interventions he made in the economy. Hoover was defeated in a landslide in 1932 by Democratic Franklin D. Roosevelt and spent the rest of his life as a conservative denouncing big government, liberalism and federal intervention in economic affairs as Democrats repeatedly used his Depression record to attack conservatism and justify more regulation of the economy.

February was added to the Roman calendar in 713 BC. The length of the month changed over time and, at one time, it had as few as 23 days. When Julius Caesar remade the Roman calendar, the month was assigned

28 days during normal years and 29 days during leap years which occurred every four years.

About President's Day – This holiday is most commonly called President's Day, but the federal holiday is officially called Washington's Birthday. The day honors all of the previous presidents of the United States. President's Day is the third Monday in February. Washington's Birthday is a national federal holiday. Many states celebrate Washington's Day while other states officially call the day President's Day. The holiday is held on or around President George Washington's birthday, which is on February 22nd. President Abraham Lincoln's birthday, February 12, is also near this date and is often honored on President's day.



Voting in America

Who can vote? The right to vote is sometimes referred to as “suffrage.” The right of suffrage in the United States is currently enjoyed by all citizens over the age of 18. However, this has not always been the case. In the early years of the Republic, the eligible electorate consisted primarily of white, male, property owners. States gradually relaxed property-ownership requirements until most male citizens of 21 years or more were allowed to vote. After the Civil War, the right to vote was extended to all citizens, regardless of race, by the 13th Amendment to the Constitution. The Women's Suffrage Movement succeeded with the 19th Amendment and the extension of the right to vote to women (some states already allowed women to vote, but the Amendment required all states to do so). The 23rd Amendment allotted electoral votes to the District of Columbia, thereby giving its

residents the right to vote in presidential elections. And the 26th Amendment, ratified in 1971, granted the right to vote to every citizen 18 years of age or older.

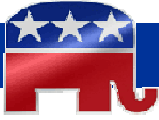
Simply because voting rights are formally extended by the Constitution, however, does not mean they are actually exercised. Most notably, black voters did not fully enjoy the right to vote for many years after the ratification of the 13th Amendment because of intimidation, discrimination and tactics such as literacy tests and poll taxes (see *The Civil Rights Movement*). Moreover, many people who have the right to vote simply choose not to exercise it. To date, millions of eligible voters have not registered to vote. Source: *The Nation.com*

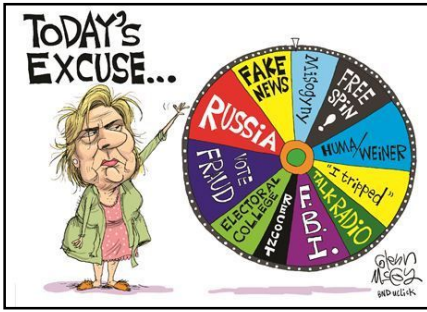

Hillary could still become President!

Harvard law professor Lawrence Lessig has claimed that if the investigation into Russian meddling in the 2016 presidential election finds evidence of a conspiracy, Hillary Clinton could still end up being president.

How on earth would that happen? According to an essay by Lessig, the scenario would begin with a finding of conspiracy by Special Counsel Robert

Mueller, followed by the simultaneous impeachment and removal from office of both President Donald Trump and Vice President Mike Pence. If all of this happened, House Speaker Paul Ryan would become president and then, according to Lessig, Ryan should do the "right thing" and nominate Hillary Clinton to be his vice president, then step aside and let her assume the presidency. Lessig noted that the hypotheticals he wrote about in his essay would apply to only the specific scenario he described. "The remedy that I...outline[d] only makes sense if you believe the election was stolen," he said.
