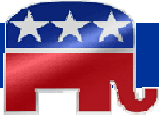

State GOP Cancels the 2020 Presidential Caucus

The Nevada GOP's Central Committee, meeting in Winnemucca, has voted to cancel its 2020 presidential caucus and opted instead to hold a State Central Committee endorsement vote at a date to be determined later. The caucuses to nominate Washoe County GOP Central Committee members and elect delegates to the Washoe County GOP's biennial convention will still take place just as they do in non-presidential election years such as (most recently) 2018. Voter turnout, however, is expected to be much lower than it would have been had President Trump been on the ballot.

The Kansas, South Carolina and Arizona GOPs have also cancelled their presidential primaries or caucuses, as is not unusual for either party when an incumbent president is

running for reelection. Republicans cancelled 8 primaries in 1992 and 10 in 2004, while Democrats cancelled 8 primaries and caucuses in 1996 and 10 in 2012, according to the RNC.

State GOP Chairman Michael McDonald also defeated two challengers to win election to his fifth term. A former Las Vegas City Councilman, McDonald defeated Mesquite City Councilwoman Annie Black and former Clark County GOP Chairman Dave McKeon on the first ballot.

Pam Robinson most recently was the Policy Director for former Governor Brian Sandoval. She was responsible for energy, natural resources and tourism issues for the Governor, as well as special

projects. She also supervised the Washington, D.C. office and managed the issues associated with the Western Governors' Association and the National Governors' Association.

Prior to her appointment by Governor Sandoval, Pam served as Chief of Staff to Lieutenant Governor Brian Krolicki and managed Nevada's Sesquicentennial celebration, which included over 500 events held all around the State.

Pam's professional career began as staff to the late Congresswoman Barbara Vucanovich, for whom she ultimately served as Legislative Director before joining the professional staff of the former U.S. House of Representatives Interior Committee, now known as the Natural Resources Committee.

After relocating back to the West from Washington, D.C., she served as the legislative liaison for the United States Forest Service at Lake Tahoe. Her federal career concluded working in the Nevada offices of Senator John Ensign and Senator Dean Heller.

Robinson was honored by the Nevada Women's Fund as one of its 2017 Women of

Achievement. In 2018, Governor Brian Sandoval appointed Pam to the Nevada Commission on Tourism. She also serves on the non-profit "Friends of the Mansion" which helps raise funds for Nevada's Governor's Mansion.

A native of Utah, Pam is an active volunteer in Carson City, including church activities and the Boys and Girls Club of Western Nevada. She enjoys cooking, antiquing, hunting and exploring off-the-grid destinations in Nevada – Jarbidge being a favorite – especially with her husband, Steve, and son, Matt.

Cons to Yucca Mountain

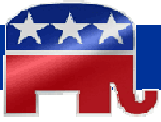


- Nevada should not have to store other states' waste
- Risk of contamination while transporting waste to the site
- Approximately 90 miles northwest of Las Vegas
- Chance of earthquakes in the area, which could lead to corrosion
- Uncertainty- what will really happen in the future? Will this repository really work?

The Yucca Mountain Nuclear Waste Repository, as designated by the Nuclear Waste Policy Act



amendments of 1987, is proposed to be a deep geological repository storage facility within Yucca Mountain for spent nuclear fuel and other high-level radioactive waste in the United States. The site is located on federal land adjacent to the Nevada Test Site in Nye County, Nevada, about 80 miles northwest of the Las Vegas Valley.

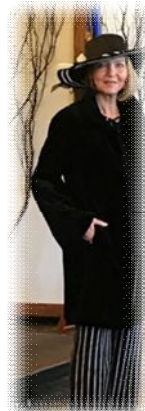

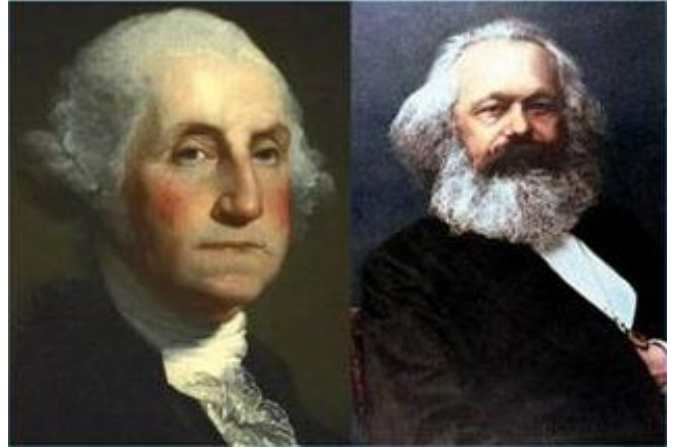


Living it up at the Hotel California

Donald Trump threatens environmental actions against San Francisco



President Donald Trump on Wednesday threatened to use his Environmental Protection Agency to warn San

Francisco that the city's ongoing struggle with homelessness is violating environmental rules.

"We can't have our cities going to hell," Trump said. "It's a terrible situation that's in Los Angeles and in San Francisco," Trump told reporters flying with him on Air Force One. "And we're going to be giving San Francisco – they're in total violation – we're going to be giving them a notice very soon."

It was not immediately clear which environmental laws Trump was referring to, or on what authority the Environmental Protection Agency would act. Trump, who was recently traveling in California for campaign fundraisers, said pollution was flowing into the ocean because of waste in storm sewers.

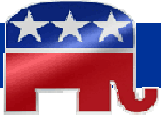

American History, Alive in Stone



In October of 1927 work began on Mount Rushmore and in October of 1941 the Mt. Rushmore sculpture was completed.

Majestic figures of Presidents George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln, surrounded by the beauty of the Black Hills of South Dakota, tell the story of the birth, growth, development and preservation of this country. Mount Rushmore National Memorial is centered on a sculpture carved into the granite face of Mount Rushmore in the Black Hills in Keystone, South Dakota.

Sculptor Gutzon Borglum created the sculpture's design and oversaw the project's execution from 1927 to 1941 with the help of his son Lincoln Borglum. The sculpture features the 60-foot heads of Presidents George Washington (1732–1799), Thomas Jefferson (1743–1826), Theodore Roosevelt (1858–1919), and Abraham Lincoln (1809–1865). The four presidents were chosen to represent the nation's birth, growth, development, and preservation, respectively. The memorial park covers 1,278.45 acres and is 5,725 feet above sea level.

South Dakota historian Doane Robinson is credited with conceiving the idea of carving the likenesses of famous people into the Black Hills region of South Dakota in order to promote tourism in the region. Robinson initially wanted the sculptures to feature American West heroes such as Lewis and Clark, Red Cloud, and Buffalo Bill Cody, but Borglum decided that the sculpture should have broader appeal and chose the four presidents.

Republican U.S. Senator from South Dakota Peter Norbeck sponsored the project and secured federal funding; construction began in 1927 and the presidents' faces were completed between 1934 and 1939. Gutzon Borglum died in March 1941, and his son Lincoln took over as leader of the construction project. Each president was originally to be depicted from head to waist, but lack of funding forced construction to end on October 31, 1941.

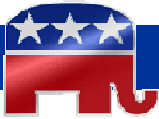


2010 Digital Scanning Project

In 2010, Mount Rushmore National Memorial embarked on a ground-breaking three-dimensional laser scanning project. Memorial staff used the latest laser scanning technology to create a highly detailed record of the sculpture and other historic resources at the park. The value of the 3-D scanning provides realistic digital information

of the site and provides opportunities for innovative and interactive public interpretation, education, research and security programs. In the event of an incident resulting in the damage of the sculpture, the data would provide the information necessary to accurately replicate carved surfaces. The digital data will also give the National Park Service the ability to develop a very realistic interactive model for Mount Rushmore for education and interpretation including potential “virtual tours” of the memorial site.

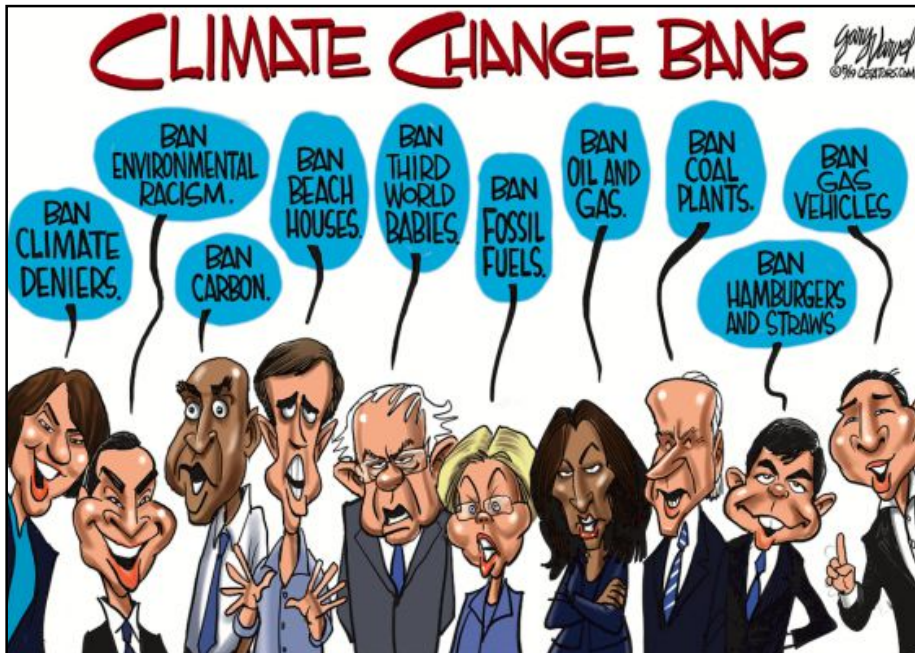
