Nevada Sheriffs: 'We do not believe that the answer to gun crime is making criminals out of otherwise lawabiding citizens.'

All 17 of the county sheriffs in Nevada have signed the "Nevada Sheriffs' Letter to Constituents," highlights of which follow.

"The United States Constitution is the foundation upon which this great country of ours is built. It is what binds us together as one people. The Sheriffs of the State of Nevada are Constitutional Officers, sworn to uphold the Constitutions of this state and this country.

"In recent months, tragic events have occurred causing much discussion pertaining to firearms issues and the Second Amendment....

"We have all seen what persons who have mental illness, are users of illegal controlled substances or are members of criminal gangs can do with weapons in their hands; any weapons, not just firearms....[M]any of these individuals are not entered into the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS)....This issue must be addressed....HIPAA must be amended to allow or even mandate reporting of the mentally ill by certain health care providers. Courts must ensure the entry of persons who have been adjudicated mentally ill or convicted of disqualifying crimes. Persons who have been validated as criminal gang members should be prohibited from purchasing or possessing firearms. Local jurisdictions must

make NICS entry a top priority. Information systems must be utilized to their utmost potential.

"The Sheriffs of the State of Nevada do not believe that the answer to this issue includes making criminals out of otherwise law-abiding citizens. As the old saying goes, 'When guns are outlawed, only outlaws will have guns.' The answer lies within a myriad of approaches including education, addressing violence, keeping firearms out of the hands of the mentally ill, criminal gang members and illegal controlled substance users, as well as prosecuting and incarcerating those who use firearms to commit crimes....

"The Sheriffs of the State of Nevada are here to enforce the laws and uphold the Constitutions of this state and this country. We will do so with all persons, while still protecting our Second Amendment freedoms....

"We will work within the law and not succumb to perceived threats, rumor, false or malicious information to weight our decision-making process.

"We as Nevada Sheriffs support The Right to Bear Arms, and we will do all within our power to uphold and defend its principles."



CNN's Ratings are Now in PANIC Territory.

The Daily Wire recently recounted that the ongoing decrease in

viewers of CNN has hit a new low. Ronald Reagan and His Enduring Relevance in the Face of Totalitarianism

Parliament at Westminster, delivered on June 8, 1982, continues to inspire in its vision and relevance. When Reagan gave his eloquent review of the Cold War and prediction about its final decade, he famously stated that the Soviet Union and its ideas would end up on the "ash heap of history." Which they did.

Democracy, Reagan predicted, would be on the march around the globe. The following year, Reagan created the National Endowment for Democracy to move that vision forward. Today, the endowment is active in 90 countries, and many nations formerly oppressed by Soviet communism are enjoying a freedom and prosperity their parents' generation could only dream of.

The Berlin Wall fell, and so did the Soviet Empire, under pressure from the West and the internal demands of its own citizens. Yet, today, neither international bad actors nor bad ideas have disappeared from the face of the earth. We did not arrive at the "end of history" with the fall of the Soviet Union in 1991.

The freedoms that so many fought and died for during the Cold War must be defended continuously. Accordingly, Reagan's Westminster speech bears rereading again and again. The recent state visit of President Donald Trump to Britain has aimed to cement trade and political ties in the "special relationship" between the U.S. and the U.K. The British royal family put on a good show, and outgoing Prime Minister Theresa May did the same. But the British elites, the U.K. media, and the left were up in arms. Labour Party leader Jeremy Corbyn refused to attend the state

dinner with the queen in Trump's honor, and London Mayor Sadiq Khan accused Trump of being the "poster boy" for the far right.

In 1982, a time of great turmoil over the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces in Europe, Reagan reminded the Brits of the two countries' "special relationship"...

"Speaking for all Americans, I want to say how very much at home we feel in your house. Every American would, because this is, as we have been so eloquently told, one of democracy's shrines," he said. "Here the rights of free people and the processes of representation have been debated and refined."

Today, Russia seeks to exploit every possible crack in the West, just as the Soviets did during the Cold War. Most recently, Russian efforts to undermine faith in our democratic institutions and media met with overwhelming success in the 2016 U.S. presidential election.

In 1982, Reagan spoke of the evils of totalitarianism. "We're approaching the end of a bloody century plagued by a terrible political invention – totalitarianism. Optimism comes less easily today, not because democracy is less vigorous, but because democracy's enemies have refined their instruments of repression," he said. "Yet optimism is in order, because day-by-day democracy is proving itself to be a not-at-all-fragile flower. ... Regimes planted by bayonets do not take root."

Today, bad actors like Cuba and Russia are wreaking havoc on the international stage. The devastation of Venezuela is a case in point. Iran continues its pursuit of nuclear capability and its support of Middle Eastern terrorism aimed at Israel and moderate Arab states. China seeks regional domination and has global ambitions.

In 1982, Reagan spoke of confronting the enemy. "At the same time, we see totalitarian forces in the world who seek subversion and conflict around the globe to further their barbarous assault on the human spirit," he said. "What, then, is our course? Must civilization perish in a hail of fiery atoms?

anufacturing jobs in the United States increased by 3,000 from April to May, rising from 12,836,000 to 12.839.000, according to the recent employment report

released by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. That is the largest number of manufacturing jobs the U.S. economy has sustained since December 2008, according to the historical employment data published by the BLS. In the last month

of 2008, there were 12,850,000 manufacturing jobs in the United States, according to BLS. But in January 2009, the manufacturing sector lost 289,000 jobs as manufacturing employment dropped to 12,561,000.

Trump's focus on manufacturing brought out high-profile critics who scoffed at the notion. President Obama notably said in June 2016 that manufacturing jobs "are just not going to come back." He said this at a time when manufacturing job growth had flat lined, falling by 31,000 from January of 2016 to when he delivered his pessimistic comments in June of that year.

The BLS has published the historical manufacturing employment numbers going back to 1939. Since then, manufacturing jobs in the United States peaked in June 1979, when they hit 19,553,000. In the years since that 1979 peak, they hit a low of 11,453,000 in February and March of 2011. Since that 2011 nadir, the U.S. has added 1,386,000 manufacturing jobs to reach the 12,839,000 seen in May.

Republicans in a Nation Needing Repair

Less taxes and spending won't resolve America's deep crisis. We need a farsighted conservatism.

I want to say something big, quickly and broadly. This week I talked with an intelligent politician who is trying to figure out the future of the Republican Party. He said that in presidential cycles down the road, it will be a relief to get back to the old conservatism of smaller government, tax cuts and reduced spending. I told him what I say to my friends: That old conservatism was deeply pertinent to its era and philosophically right, but it is not fully in line with the crises of our time or its reigning facts. As Lincoln said, the dogmas of the past are inadequate to the present: "As the cause is new, so we must think anew, and act anew."

Here is how I see it . . .

The federal government will not become smaller or less expensive in our lifetimes. There is no political will for it among elected officials in Washington, many of whom privately admit this. Nor is there sufficient will for it within the Republican or Democratic Party, or among the majority of their voters. Even if there were such a will, both parties in Washington have trouble working together on such big things.

But beyond that fact is something bigger. America needs help right now and Americans know it. It has been enduring for many years a continuing cultural

catastrophe—illegitimacy, the decline of faith, low family formation, child abuse and neglect, drugs, and inadequate public education. All this exists alongside an entertainment culture on which the poor and neglected are dependent, and which is devoted to violence, sex and nihilism. As a people we are constantly, bitterly pitted against each other, and force-fed the idea of America as an illegitimate, ugly, racist and misogynist nation. Even honest love of country isn't allowed to hold us together anymore.

America to my mind is what Pope Francis said the church was: a field hospital after battle. We are a beautiful and great nation but a needy, torn-up one in need of repair.

All that takes place within a larger historical context

You can't see all the world's weapons and all its madness and not know that eventually we will face a terrible day or days when everything will depend on our ability to hold together and hold on. Maybe it will involve nuclear weapons, maybe an extended, rolling attack on the grid, maybe bioterrorism. But it will be bad; there will be deep stress and violence. The great question in those days, under that acute pressure, will be: Will we hold together? Will we suffer through and emerge, together, on the other side? Which is another way of saying: Will we continue as a nation, a people?

My belief is that whatever helps us hold together now, whatever brings us together and binds us close, is good, and must be encouraged with whatever it takes. If these are your predicates – America in cultural catastrophe, and hard history ahead – you spend your energies on a battle not to make government significantly smaller, but to make it significantly more helpful.

That would mean a shift. Republicans should stand for a federal government whose aim and focus are directed toward conservative ends, a government focused on

concerns that have to do with conserving. They should do this not furtively or through strategic inaction but as a matter of declared political intent, in a way that is driven by moral seriousness, not polls and patter about populism.



What would a large government harnessed toward conservative ends look like?

Judging by what its presidential candidates are saying on the campaign trail, the Democratic Party intends to aim its energies in a progressive direction—global climate change, free college, reparations for slavery.

A conservative path would address the immediate crises Americans on the ground see all around them. On domestic issues this would include the following:

- Whatever might help families form and grow.
- Teaching the lost boys and girls of the working and middle classes, black and white, how to live. The infrastructure bills floating out there are good because we need better bridges, tunnels and roads, and the pride that would come from making them better. But also because they could provide a stage for a national mentorship program in which men and women instructors teach boys and girls how to do something constructive.
- Resolving the mental-health crisis. We need a vast overhaul of services so families can get the help they need. We deinstitutionalized sick people and closed the hospitals in the 1960s through '80s.
 Liberals pushed it for reasons of ideology and conservatives accepted it for reasons of savings. It marked a great denying of reality: We need hospitals for the mentally ill.
- Helping immigrants become Americans. However the illegal-immigration crisis is resolved, or not, there are tens of millions already here. Who helps make them Americans? We used to have settlement houses for the great waves of immigrants who came in the early 20th century. Why not now? They need instruction on the meaning and history of America. Here it should be noted that we have some of the best immigrants in the world, who work hard and have no hostility to American religious culture. In fact, they're part of that culture. Help Americanize them in other ways.
- Help revitalize small towns. Whatever will help, do it. We lose a lot when we lose those old shared

ways and values. We can't all live in cities and suburbs; we need diversity.

Protect religious freedom. The threats are real and will grow.
 Americans may not always be breaking down the doors to go to church, but they respect religious life and don't want to see it under siege.

Really, the point of conservatism is to conserve . . .

Here we degenerate into mere practical political advice for the GOP. Americans would respect the Republican Party if it gave the impression its leaders are actually noticing America and have a farsighted sense of its real plights. If the government is going to be large, people might be inclined to see sober-minded Republicans as the best stewards of it. It is still only the GOP that can perform the fundamental mission of protecting the system that yielded all our wealth and allowed us to be generous

with the world and with ourselves—free-market capitalism. Only the GOP can do this, because Republicans genuinely love economic freedom. You fight hard for what you love. Progressives do not love it. Republicans will be expected to foster and encourage the economic growth that can at least make a mild dent in our deficits. When you are understood not to be hostile to all spending you have greater leeway to see it coolly, and go after waste and fraud in spending. Republicans naturally enjoy that.

When you think like this – we are in a crisis, it will get worse, we must accentuate what holds us together and helps us muddle through – it helps you prioritize. These are my priorities as a conservative.

n the Fourth of July, we celebrate the birth of our great nation with picnics, fireworks, the colors of the American flag, and time with friends and family. Learn the true meaning, history, and facts behind this important day. . . . It's our nation's designated birthday!

Independence Day, also known as the Fourth of July, is the day that's long been designated as the birthdate of our great nation, which declared its independence from Great Britain by adopting the Declaration of Independence in early July 1776. Unlike the U.S. history you may or may not have learned in school, you probably knew about this July 4th date's importance to our countries history. But you may not have known that the Declaration of Independence wasn't necessarily signed on July 4th. – But it could just as easily be celebrated on July 2nd.



It was on the *second* day of July 1776 that the governing body of the 13 colonies, known as the Continental Congress, voted in favor of declaring themselves independent of British rule, according to <u>History.com</u>. But it was on July 4, 1776, that the Declaration of Independence was finalized as a written document, and it's "July 4, 1776" that appears on the document as its official date.

John Adams wasn't happy about the choice of dates. On July 3, 1776, John Adams, who went on to become our second president, wrote a letter to his wife, Abigail, to tell her how excited he was that Congress had voted in favor of independence.



"The Second Day of July 1776, will be the most memorable Epocha, in the History of America," he declared. Adams so firmly believed that July 2 was the correct day on which to celebrate American independence that he refused to appear at July 4th events as a matter of principle.
