#### About our Speaker, PATRICIA MOSER MORRIS



atricia J. Moser Morris has been the Legislative Chair of the Nevada Federation of Republican Women and her club, the Incline Village/ Crystal Bay Republican Women (IVCBRW), since 2015. She is in her second year as First Vice President (Programs) of

IVCBRW club. She also serves as a trilingual on-line missionary for Global Media Outreach, a nondenominational evangelical Christian organization.

Patricia was born in the suburbs of Washington, D.C. to parents Margarette and James M. Moser, Jr. She has two brothers and four sisters.

By the time Patricia was in the fourth grade she read the family newspaper every day. (After reading the newspaper, she learned to carefully refold the paper so her father could enjoy the paper after work!) By age 11 she was an avid reader and would often prepare school reports about local and world events.

Early on, Patricia was fascinated with the world of politics and interested in foreign languages. At age 12 she became alarmed at the Soviet Union's dishonesty on an issue and called the Russian Embassy in Washington, D.C. The man that answered, "Russian Embassy, may I help you?" got an earful! Patricia told him that Russia was acting as a "prevaricator" of the truth!

Patricia continued to be enamored with government, language, and politics – especially after reading a

gripping political thriller called "7 Days in May" by Fletcher Knebel and Charles W. Bailey II.

Fulfilling her goal of government employment, Patricia spent over 11 years in the U.S. Foreign Service managing government-to-government and government-to-public policy-related public relations programs in Kenya, Cameroon, Chad, Venezuela, Ecuador and Latin America in general.

After her employment with the U.S. Foreign Service, Patricia was employed by the County of Riverside and managed the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program in the Fourth Supervisorial District. She organized, promoted and conducted community meetings in English and Spanish and oversaw many county public services.

Patricia served for 18 years as Assistant to the City Manager of the City of Barstow, California, where she met her husband, John Morris. During this time, she designed and implemented the City's advocacy program on the county, state and federal levels, identifying pertinent problems, developing positions on the issues, and working directly with consultants and federal, state, county and regional elected officials and their staffs to advance the City's positions. Examples of results of this advocacy program are special grants totaling over \$6 million dollars from two federal agencies. She also developed and managed the City's successful program to prevent the closure of Marine Corps Logistics Base Barstow; and initiated and coordinated the negotiations that resulted in the successful annexation by the City of Barstow of the Nebo Annex of Marine Corps Logistics Base Barstow.

Patricia is proficient in public speaking, editing and writing for publication, and is fluent in Spanish and French. She holds a BA in International Affairs from The George Washington University (graduating "With Distinction," Phi Beta Kappa, John Henry Cowles Award). She received a Diploma from the University of Paris with "mention de bien" (equivalent to cum laude), and a Masters of International Public Policy from John Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies















#### INAUGURAL INSIGHTS

The Chief Justice of the United States John Roberts administered the Oath of Office to President-elect Donald J. Trump. Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States Clarence Thomas administered

the Oath of Office to Vice President-elect Michael R. Pence. Justice Thomas is the

first African-American in history to administer the Oath of Office to the Vice President or President of the United States.

President-elect Trump was sworn-in using his childhood Bible (presented to him by his mother upon his graduation of Sunday Church Primary School at First Presbyterian Church, Jamaica, New York) as well as the same Bible that President Abraham Lincoln used at his first Inauguration. The Lincoln Bible is part of the collections of the Library of Congress and has been used at three inaugurals: 1861, 2009, and 2013.

The Vice President-elect also will become the first officeholder, since President Ronald Reagan, to take the oath using The Reagan Family Bible.









#### About Inauguration Day

Inauguration Day is the day that the President-elect becomes officially sworn in as the President of the

United States. This is often symbolized by the tradition of the President taking his oath of office with his hand on a Bible.

This tradition was first begun by George Washington during his first inauguration. While some Presidents have opened the Bible to a random page (like George Washington in 1789 and Abraham Lincoln in 1861), most others have opened the Bible to a specific page because of a meaningful verse.

Of course, there is always the option to keep the Bible closed like Harry Truman did in 1945 and John F. Kennedy in 1961. Some Presidents even had two Bibles (with either both opened to the same verse or two different verses), while only one President refrained from using a Bible at all (Theodore Roosevelt in 1901).

# The Los Angeles Times has published all the inaugural addresses since 1885.

# Trump's Cabinet is More Diverse than Obama's

s the 45th President of the United States took his oath of office, it is important for us to pause and compare his cabinet with that of his predecessor's. While much has been made of the lack of

superficial diversity (ethnicity, national origin, skin color, etc.), scant attention has been paid to the diversity of thought. Of the 15 cabinet positions, four of them are former CEOs. Five of them have prior military experience and three of them are accomplished medical Doctors. Just two of them have all their experience in government. They all bring different perspectives to the table. They have run organizations with close to 100,000 employees. They understand the economic havoc reactionary legislations like Sarbanes-Oxley and Dodd-Frank can wreak. They grasp the competitive disadvantage of American corporations resulting from onerous regulations. They have seen firsthand that such regulations lead to lost jobs. They lived their entire lives in an environment where success is defined, results are measured – in other words, success leads to rewards and failure has negative consequences.

Contrast that with former President Obama's cabinet. Of the 15 cabinet members, 13 of them came from purely government backgrounds. Those cabinet members and Obama himself never created a single job, never worked in the private sector (which is a vast majority of the U.S. economy) and never worked in an environment where when you fail, you will be out of a job and you may end up sinking the entire ship. Most of Obama's cabinet did not understand the feeling of showing up to work only to have your badge not work. They haven't seen coworkers lose jobs because they did not deliver results. Layoffs, firings due to lack of performance and disciplinary action are alien



to them. When was the last time we heard of a lay-off in government? Their experience is restricted to a protected environment where when you fail, you get more funding and bigger budgets, all at the expense of the taxpayer.

One final point: Unlike professional politicians such as the Clintons who now have a net worth of over \$100 million after being "dead broke" when they left the White House and Harry Reid who mysteriously accumulated over \$10 million in wealth on a government salary, Trump and his cabinet picks are sacrificing over \$100 million a year in lost income and giving up their privacy to serve this great country. Serving America is an honor and it should not involve financial benefit. They have set an excellent standard for others to follow. And if they fail to deliver results, President Trump will not hesitate to replace them with someone who can get the job done. New era. New leadership. Real diversity. A stronger, powerful and economically dominant America that leads from the front.

#### **Commemorating President's Day**

The Smithsonian Book of Presidential Trivia from Smithsonian Books is a great read to commemorate the Presidents' Day holiday. Here are some nuggets excerpted from the book that reveal a few unexpected facts about our commanders-in-chief.

George Washington owned a profitable whiskey distillery. Whiskey was one of Washington's most important business ventures at Mount Vernon. At peak production in 1799, the distillery used five stills and a boiler and produced eleven thousand gallons of whiskey. With sales of \$7,500 that year, it was perhaps the country's largest distillery. Washington's plantation manager James Anderson, a Scottish man with distilling experience, urged him to start the venture, which was also an efficient way to use unsold ground wheat, corn and rye.

#### James Madison held the first Inaugural Ball.

Although there was a ball in 1789 to honor the election of George Washington, the first official inaugural ball did not occur until 1809, when Madison took office. Madison was sworn in at the U.S. Capitol. That evening his wife, Dolley Madison, hosted a gala at Long's Hotel. The price of admissions was four dollars per ticket. Four hundred tickets were sold, and so began a Washington tradition. Today the Presidential Inaugural Committee plans all the official inaugural balls.

Gerald Ford was a fashion model in his youth (even appearing on the cover of *Cosmopolitan*). Ford's first

love was a woman named Phyllis Brown, an attractive blonde who became a fashion model. Brown persuaded Ford to invest in a modeling agency and to do some modeling himself. Together they appeared in ski resort spread of *Look* magazine (1940) and on a cover of Cosmopolitan (1942). Ultimately, the pair broke up. She wanted to continue modeling in New York and he decided to forego the runway and begin his law career. Warren Harding had the largest shoe size. Harding wore a size 14. Unfortunately, those big feet did not ensure that his administration would be on "firm footing." It turned out that Harding's trusted advisors were not so trustworthy, and his presidency was riddled with scandal. He died before his term was complete, and his wife burned his potentially incriminating correspondence. However, his stately slippers and sporty golf shoes survive at the Smithsonian.

Theodore Roosevelt wore a lock of Lincoln's hair during his inauguration. Roosevelt wore a ring with a lock of Lincoln's hair in it on March 14, 1905, at his second inauguration. Roosevelt had been a long-time admirer of Lincoln, and as a child had watched Lincoln's funeral procession pass by his house in New York. Roosevelt's admiration for Lincoln was reinforced later, when he met John Hay, who had worked for Lincoln in the White House. Hay and Roosevelt talked about Lincoln often, and Hay gave Roosevelt the ring, knowing that Roosevelt would treasure it.


Franklin D. Roosevelt was the first president to name a woman to his cabinet. FDR named Frances Perkins as secretary of labor in 1933. The Mount Holyoke College graduate was a trained social worker who had worked in settlement houses in Chicago and Philadelphia. Her efforts on behalf of labor reform took on an added urgency after the tragic Triangle Shirtwaist Factory fire in 1911. She served as industrial commissioner under Roosevelt when he was governor of New York. As labor secretary, Perkins established the Labor Standards Bureau and was a principal architect of the Social Security Act.

**John Tyler had 15 children.** Tyler was married twice. He had eight children with his first wife, Letitia. After

she died, the 54-year-old president married the 24-year-old Julia Gardiner, with whom he had seven more children.

Abraham Lincoln favored extending the right to vote for women. Lincoln was the first major leader in our history to favor extending the vote to women. In 1836 – a full 12 years before the first woman's rights convention had even convened – State legislator Lincoln gave an Illinois paper a statement endorsing "female suffrage."
