Assemblywoman Krasner is an advocate for victim's rights, small business owners, quality education, children and senior citizens. She has consistency opposed raising taxes on Nevada families and businesses.

As a freshman legislator, she successfully passed legislation to extend the statute of limitations for child victims of sexual abuse. Lisa served on four legislative committees: Judiciary, Corrections Parole and Probation, Education, and Natural Resources & Mining. For the State Legislative session, Lisa served on the Health and Human Services Committee, Education Committee and Judiciary Committee. She also served as the Assembly Republican Whip. Born in California, Lisa gained her work ethics from her father who legally immigrated to the United States. He taught himself to read and write, to speak English, and to follow the rules in applying for residency to a new country. Assemblywoman Krasner was the first in her family to attend and graduate from college, receiving her BA Degree from UCLA and her law degree from the University of La Verne College. She is an adjunct professor of at Truckee Meadows Community College where she teaches courses on the U.S. Constitution and the Nevada State Constitution. She also taught courses at the University of Phoenix for six years.

Assemblywoman Krasner's public service includes serving as a Commissioner for the State of Nevada

Commission on Aging (3 years), Commissioner of the City of Reno Recreation and Parks Commission (7 years, and the Board of the State of Nevada Parent-Teacher Association. She has also served as President of the Reno Philharmonic Guild. Additionally, she is a member of the Washoe Republican Central Committee, an associate member of three other Republican clubs and a full member of our own Incline Village-Crystal Bay Republican Women's Club.

Assemblywoman Krasner is married to a medical doctor, Charles Krasner, and they have two sons.

You can also mail in your ballot and go to www.washoecounty.us/voters to watch a video on how to mark and return your ballot. Your ballot MUST BE postmarked by November 3rd. WE DO NOT RECOMMEND MAILING YOUR BALLOT UNLESS YOU CANNOT VOTE IN PERSON. You can also drop off your ballot at Washoe County Registrar of Voters at 1001 E. Ninth Street, Reno, or other designated locations. If you plan to vote in person, the instructions say not to mark your ballot since you'll be surrendering your ballot when you vote in person. POSTAL UNION ENDORSES BIDEN

The 300,000-member National Association of Letter Carriers recently said that the union's executive council had endorsed Democrat Joe Biden for president, warning "the very survival" of the U.S. Postal Service is at stake.

The union criticized Republican President Donald Trump and his administration for refusing "to provide the necessary financial relief that would strengthen the agency during this pandemic." The union called Biden "a fierce ally and defender" of the Postal Service. Democrats have seized on changes made by new Postmaster Genera Louis DeJoy, a Trump supporter, that they say has led to a dramatic increase in delayed and undelivered mail. Trump responded that "They want \$25 billion for the post office. Now, they need that money in order to have the post office work so it can take all of these millions and millions of ballots," Trump said. "But if they don't get those two items, that means you can't have universal mail-in voting because they're not equipped to have it."

Some Amy Coney Barrett quotes from the confirmation hearings

"I certainly hope that all members of the committee have more confidence in my integrity than to think I would allow myself to be used as a pawn to decide this election for the American people."

"I am not hostile to the [Affordable Care Act]. I am not hostile to any statute that you pass. ... I apply the law. I follow the law. You make the policy."





"If I express a view on a precedent one way or another, whether I say I love it or I hate it, it signals to litigants that I might tilt one way or another in a pending case."

"If I give off-the-cuff answers, then I would be basically a legal pundit. And I don't think we want judges to be legal pundits. I think we went judges to approach cases thoughtfully and with an open mind."

"Judges can't just wake up one day and say 'I have an agenda. I like guns; I hate guns. I like abortion; I hate abortion,' and walk in like a royal queen and impose their will on the world. ... I have an agenda to stick to the Rule of Law."




THINGS INVENTED BY WOMEN

THE CAR HEATER - Margaret A. Wilcox, born in 1838, was one of the first women mechanical engineers. She is notable for inventing the first automobile heater in 1893, and the first combined clothes and dishwasher machine.

MONOPOLY – This popular board game was designed by Elizabeth Magie in 1904, originally called the Landlord's Game. The purpose of this game was to expose the injustices of unchecked capitalism. Her game was ripped off by Charles Darrow who sold it to Parker Brothers 30







vears later. However, Parker

Brothers later paid Elizabeth \$500 for her game.

THE LIFE RAFT – The lifesaving Life Raft was invented by Maria Beasely in 1882. (Maria also invented a machine that makes barrels.)

RESIDENTIAL SOLAR HEATING – Solar heating for residential housing was invented by Dr. Maria Telkes in 1947. Dr. Telkes was a psychiatrist in addition to being a solar-power pioneer.



THE MEDICAL SYRINGE - Letitia Mumford Geer, born in 1852, was an inventor who patented the one-hand operated syringe that is the basis for most modern medical syringes. The patent was granted in 1899.

THE MODERN ELECTRIC REFRIGERATOR – In 1914, Florence Parpart invented the modern electric fridge. Parpart also received a patent for a much-improved street-cleaning machine in 1900. The electric refrigerator was invented by Florence Parpart in 1914.

THE ICE CREAM MAKER – The ice cream maker was invented by a woman named Nancy Johnson in 1843. Her patented design is still used today!

THE FIRE ESCAPE – The fire escape was invented by Anna Connelly in 1887.

THE DISHWASHER – Born in 1839, Josephine Cochran invented the first practical dishwasher and patented it in 1886. She formed the Garis-Cochran Dish -Washing Company to manufacture and market it. Before her time, she marketed her machine to hotel owners.









THE COMPUTER ALGORITHM – Augusta Ada King, Countess of Lovelace was an English mathematician and writer, chiefly known for her work on Charles Babbage's proposed mechanical general-purpose computer, the Analytical Engine. In fact, her notes were an essential key to helping Alan Turing's work on the first modern computers in the 1940s.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY – Shirley Ann Jackson is a physicist and president of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, the oldest technological research university in the U.S. Some of the Telecommunication Technology developed by Dr. Shirley Jackson includes the portable fax, touch tone telephone, solar cells, fibre optic cables, and the

technology behind caller ID and call waiting.







WIRELESS TRANSMISSION TECHNOLOGY – Hedy Lamarr, a world-famous film star, invented a secret communications system during World War II for radio-controlling torpedoes. This technology also paved the way for everything from Wi-Fi to GPS.

CLOSED-CIRCUIT TELEVISION

SECURITY (CCTV) – Working as a nurse, Marie Van Brittan Brown's hours were not standard and living in a high-crime area made her want to feel safe, so she invented the first home security system. The system enabled her to know who was at her home and to notify police right away if needed. The invention featured peepholes, a camera, monitors, a 2-way microphone, and an alarm button. She filed the patent with her husband Albert in 1966 and was granted the patent in 1969. This revolutionary invention is the progenitor of security systems homes and businesses still use today.

THE MODERN PAPER BAG – Margaret Knight invented a machine that makes square bottomed paper bags in 1871. She almost didn't get credit when Charles Anan tried to steal her work claiming that it wasn't possible for a woman to create this brilliant invention. (Margaret also invented a safety device for cotton mills when she was 12. That invention is still being used today.)

COMPUTER SOFTWARE – Dr. Grace Murray Hopper was a computer scientist who invented COBOL which is the first user-friendly business computer software system in the 1940's. She was also a rear admiral in the U.S. navy and the first person to use the term "bug" in reference to a glitch in a computer system when she literally found a bug (moth) causing problems with her computer.

CENTRAL HEATING – Although Alice Parker's invention in 1919 of a gaspowered central heater was never manufactured, her idea was the first that allowed for using natural gas to heat a home, inspiring the central heating systems used today.

WINDSHIELD WIPERS – Mary Anderson made an essential contribution to the world of cars by inventing the windshield wiper. Although she did not drive a car herself, when she saw people in New York jumping out of their cars and opening the window to see when it rained, she felt the need to do something.







Kamala Harris Lied about Abraham Lincoln and the Supreme Court

uring the recent vice-presidential debate, Kamala Harris argued that President Donald Trump should not have nominated Amy Coney Barrett to

replace the late Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, and she cited as her precedent none other than Abraham Lincoln himself — "Honest Abe." As it turns out, however, Harris was less than honest in her portrayal of Abraham Lincoln's record. She said:

"In 1864... Abraham Lincoln was up for reelection, and it was 27 days before the election, and a seat became open on the United States Supreme Court. Abraham Lincoln's party was in charge not only of the White House but the Senate," Harris began. "But Honest Abe said, 'It's not the right thing to do. The American people deserve to make the decision about who will be the next president of the United States and then that person can select who will serve for a lifetime on the highest court of our land."

Yet Lincoln said no such thing. In fact, the polarization of the Supreme Court is a fairly recent phenomenon, dating back to the living Constitution approach of activist judges amending the Constitution by fiat – "discovering" a right to abortion in the Fourteenth Amendment, for example. Before Roe v.

Wade (1973), and really before Joe Biden led the smear campaign against Robert Bork in 1987, Supreme Court nominations often proceeded as a matter of course. Harris was correct that when Supreme Court Chief Justice Roger B. Taney died on October 12, 1864, President Lincoln did not nominate his successor, Salmon P. Chase, until after the election. However, this had nothing to do with letting "the next president" choose the nominee, however.

As *National Review's* Dan McLaughlin explained, Lincoln delayed because the Senate was not in session when Taney died. In fact, the Senate session ended on July 4, 1864, and did not convene again until December 5, 1864. "It was once common for the Senate to be out of session for much of the summer and fall," McLaughlin wrote. The Senate session calendar confirms this. As McLaughlin noted, Lincoln nominated Chase on the very day that the Senate reconvened, and the Senate confirmed him that same day.

In other words . . . Lincoln did not delay the nomination out of some high democratic principle. He certainly did not do so in order to prevent President Donald Trump from nominating a successor to Ruth Bader Ginsburg 156 years hence. He did so because the Senate was out of session, and that may have worked to his benefit in corralling Chase to support his reelection.

Make no mistake: Kamala Harris twisted history on Lincoln and the Supreme Court — and she did so in order to dodge a far more pertinent question — Whether she and Joe Biden support packing the Court, fundamentally changing the rules of the game to support the very "living Constitution" judicial activism that politicized the Court in the first place!

About Thanksgiving Day

The first Thanksgiving was in 1621 when the Plymouth colonists and Wampanoag Indians shared an autumn harvest feast that is acknowledged today as one of the first Thanksgiving celebrations in the colonies.



In 1827, the noted

magazine editor/writer Sarah Josepha Hale launched a campaign to establish Thanksgiving as a national holiday. For 36 years, she published numerous editorials and sent scores of letters to governors, senators, presidents and other politicians, earning her the nickname the "Mother of Thanksgiving."

Abraham Lincoln finally heeded her request in 1863 at the height of the Civil War in a proclamation entreating all Americans to ask God to "commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife" and to "heal the wounds of the nation." He scheduled Thanksgiving for the final Thursday in November, and it was celebrated on that day every year until 1939, when Franklin D. Roosevelt moved the holiday up a week in an attempt to spur retail sales during the Great Depression. Roosevelt's plan, known derisively as Franksgiving, was met with passionate opposition, and in 1941 the president reluctantly signed a bill making Thanksgiving the fourth Thursday in November.


