What to Give Your "Woke" Friends for Christmas



Do you have any dear friends or relatives who don't know what the fuss is about Critical Race Theory? Any bewildered friends in Canada who are too nice to speak up? Any favorite grandchildren who insist on including their pronouns in their email signature? Here's a Christmas present for you and for them: a fictionalized but all-too-real account of life in 2025 if life as we know it continues unchecked: "Identity Crisis" by second-generation Indian-Canadian T.K. Kanwar.

The book follows two very different people – Sam, a professional Indian-Canadian man (i.e., his parents immigrated from India) in the sports media business in Toronto, and Jenny, a woke white student in New York City who has left her Wisconsin roots and values far behind her as she shouts down guest speakers at NYU in her activist frenzy. We follow their lives in parallel over the next several years as societal changes we are all in the midst of eventually come to affect them personally and the choices they make as a result. It's a preview of coming attractions, you could say, if we stay the course we are on as a society.

One of my favorite passages was the morning Jenny learns she is pregnant, followed quickly by an unrelated but nonetheless offensive broadcast text from her (Black) activist pal from NYU days saying "Fewer white babies means fewer white supremacists." The ensuing conversation between the two could be happening anywhere across the country right now, and watching it unfold ringside makes for a thoughtful and balanced read. Jordan Peterson also makes an influential appearance, to the delight of JBP fans.

Given what we see of Trudeau and trucker strikes in Canada, it should not have come as a surprise to learn of the current demise



of large Canadian cities such as Toronto. Apparently our neighbors to the north are experiencing many of the same challenges we are with social policing, homelessness, violence, and so on. A vaccination requirement to visit Montreal? It is hard to say anymore what is fantasy and what is imminent reality.

The book will not win any literary awards – a few too many people are described as "tall and slender" – but per the author's wish, the book certainly does make you stop and think about the trajectory of these crazy times we are living through. The preface – an open letter from Russian KGB agent and defector <u>Yuri Bezmenov</u> – is worth the price of the book itself. (And yes, he is a real person.) The paperback is \$12.95, or \$2.99 Kindle, where if you use <u>these links</u> you will be supporting I School.

And here is something a little disturbing but perhaps not too surprising: if you go to Amazon and look for the book by its title, Amazon does not bring it up. The only way I was able to get a link to the book is by pulling up my own order. And the Kindle version has now been renamed "Identity Crisis: A Political Novel." Which is curious, because the book does not say "A Political Novel" anywhere on the cover. And only 35 ratings? Hmmm! Perhaps this book has



GOP WINS HOUSE

The recent election of a Republican House majority is good for the economy, good for Republicans and even good for President Biden.



Inflation cooled last month, but remains at 7.7 percent over the past year — and a staggering 14 percent in the 20 months since President Biden was inaugurated. Real wages have fallen approximately 4 percent. And the stock market — even with a strong week — remains down 16 percent for the year.

The Federal Reserve is doing the heavy-lifting on inflation, and has already hiked the federal funds rate from near-zero to nearly 4 percent. This has pushed up mortgage rates from 2.6 to 7.1 percent, and combined with rising house prices to double the monthly mortgage on a new median-priced home, from \$1,148 to \$2,445.

Rather than force the Federal Reserve to slam the economy's brake pedal fully into recession, Congress and the White House need to enact policies to help pare back inflation in a pro-growth manner.

Yes, much of the inflation reflects an economic hangover from the pandemic. Yet President Biden and Democrats have actively driven prices higher through energy regulations, tariffs, Buy America rules, tightened ethanol mandates, Davis-Bacon rules raising construction costs, and restrictions on new building.

Most destructive of all has been the president's historic spending spree, which has added \$4.8 trillion to the 10year budget deficit. The Federal Reserve calculates that the President's \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan was

a major inflation contributor. The student loan bailout — that hopefully will not survive legal challenges will push inflation even higher. That will force the Federal Reserve to further rate-hike the economy into a likely recession, with significant job losses.

More than just economically damaging, forcing the Federal Reserve to hike interest rates also costs taxpayers through higher budget deficits. Each time the government's paid interest rate rises by 1 percent it adds \$2.6 trillion in federal budget interest costs over the decade. That's as much as the American Rescue Plan and student loan bailout combined.

And that is why it was so important for the November 8th Election voters to stage an intervention and take away President Biden's credit card. While the results were less than expected for the GOP, the current vote counts show that the majority of voters chose a Republican House, with inflation and the economy their top concerns.

Republicans may not have produced a comprehensive anti-inflation agenda, but their most valuable weapon will be gridlock. While Biden has already enacted \$4.8 trillion in new spending, he had proposed a staggering \$11 trillion during his 2020 campaign. Any chance of enacting the final \$6.2 trillion in remaining promises — digging the inflation and deficit ditch even deeper — is almost surely dead with a GOP House.


Ironically, this may be the best outcome for President Biden. The past two years of partisan Democratic overreach drove the president's approval rating to among the lowest of postwar presidents. Perhaps the president will become the moderate Americans thought they elected, rather than the Elizabeth Warren-clone they got instead.

We've seen this story before. President Obama spent his first two years teaming up with a Democratic Congress to enact a trillion-dollar stimulus bill and ObamaCare. Then the 2010 "shellacking" brought a GOP House that clipped Obama's most liberal wings and ultimately helped him win re-election. Before that, President Clinton and his Democratic Congress overreached on government spending and health care, until the 1994 election of a GOP Congress brought back the successful "New Democrat" that voters had wanted all along.

President Biden may or may not run for re-election in two years. However, with inflation still elevated, interest rates soaring, and budget deficits likely headed towards \$3 trillion within a decade (yes, you read that right), he and other politicians will have to abandon the lazy politics of Santa Claus. Even "free spending" brings a painful cost.

Top 5 States with the Most Illegal Immigrant Sanctuaries

There are currently 11 states in the United States of America who are classified as "Sanctuary States" for illegal immigrants. Within these states, are cities who have adopted policies to protect illegal immigrants from having their immigration status investigated by federal authorities. *These cities are known as "Sanctuary Cities," which can be defined as:*

"a city in which the local government and police protect undocumented immigrants and refugees from deportation by federal authorities: sanctuary cities where law enforcement cannot question crime suspects about their immigration status."

And in 2017, CNN described Sanctuary Cities as being:

"...applied to jurisdictions that have policies in place designed to limit cooperation with or involvement in federal immigration enforcement actions. Cities, counties and some states have a range of informal policies as well as actual laws that qualify as "sanctuary" positions. Most of the policies center around not cooperating with federal law enforcement on immigration policies. Many of the largest cities in the country have forms of such policies."

In short, Sanctuary Cities are jurisdictions in which federal immigration laws are obstructed and essentially violated. These locations harbor migrants who break federal immigration laws and arrive here illegally or overstay their visas. In fact, in many of these states, entire counties are illegal immigrant sanctuaries.

Here are the 11 states with Illegal Immigrant Sanctuaries: California, Colorado, Connecticut, Illinois, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Oregon, Vermont and Washington.

Oregon has the most Sanctuary Cities and Counties. In total, there are 30 counties who are illegal immigrant sanctuaries in Oregon. There are only 36 counties in the entire state. In addition, the cities of Eugene and Springfield are also sanctuaries.

Local politicians in the state of **Washington** have created 18 sanctuary counties for illegal immigrants in that state, including King County, home to the state's largest city Seattle. Seattle also classifies itself as a Sanctuary City. The state has 39 counties in total.

Top 5 States with the Most Illegal Immigrant Sanctuaries - American Police Officers Alliance

The Commonwealth of **Pennsylvania** is home to 15 Sanctuary Counties for illegal immigrants. While Pennsylvania is at the top of this list, the concentration of illegal immigrant sanctuaries is far less than the above states listed, as there are 67 counties in the state. Philadelphia is also classified as a Sanctuary City.

California, The Golden State, is tied with Pennsylvania on this list, with 15 Sanctuary Counties. But like Pennsylvania, the state has far more counties than Oregon and Washington, with a total of 58. The cities of Los Angeles, San Francisco, Oakland, Berkley, Watsonville, and Santa Ana are Sanctuary Cities.

Colorado, The Centennial State, rounds out the top 5 on this list, with 13 Sanctuary Counties. There are 64 counties in the state. The city of Aurora is also a Sanctuary City.

Aside from being a flagrant violation of the country's immigration laws, the existence of these sanctuaries creates potentially dangerous environments for the legal residents and citizens who live there. When it becomes local policy to shield lawbreakers from scrutiny, the slippery slope inevitably leads to letting criminals who are capable of much worse than illegal immigration walk the streets freely. This puts Law Enforcement and their communities at increased, unnecessary, and completely avoidable risk. Most of all, these sanctuaries only incentivize and perpetuate the illegal immigration crisis that this country is currently being subjected to.

Arguments in favor of sanctuary cities include the concept that the removal of fear of deportation allows undocumented immigrants to feel safe reporting crime, leading to statistically lower crime rates in some of these cities. However, while the benefits for those who are on the path to obtaining legal citizenship are numerous, the fact remains that these sanctuary cities can still obstruct departments from removing unwanted criminal offenders from a country in which they are residing illegally.
