On April 17th seven members of our club attended the NvFRW State Legislative Day organized by our State Legislative Chairman and club member Yolanda Knaak. Our day began in the Legislative building visiting legislators in their offices delivering a letter from our NvFRW President Caroline Smith requesting their NO vote on AJR6 which would abolish the Electoral College. Nevada is a less populous state and passage of this amendment would give Nevadans little control over our state's interests. The highly populated states of California, New York, Florida, and Texas would decide the fate of our country.

After our meetings we met in the Capitol building with **Governor Lombardo** who spoke briefly and answered many questions. Governor Lombardo requested the support of the NvFRW for his Education and Voter Integrity Bills. This visit concluded with a group photo of the attendees (around 40) with the Governor which was published in the national NFRW weekly newsletter Capitol Connection. The afternoon was spent in the Committee Room with various legislatures attending. We must appreciate the challenging task they have in dealing with a Democratic majority in the Legislature. *Congratulations to Yolanda for* 

planning and coordinating a wonderful educational day for the NvFRW!

Our next meeting is Tuesday May 9th at the Chateau at 11:30. This month we have invited Washoe County Board of Trustees School Board member Jeff Church to visit us again. Jeff will speak to us about the proposed closing of the Incline Village Middle School, CRT, the status and performance of Nevada schools, and suggest what we can do to help improve the educational system in Nevada.

into Spring, although they say we may go back to Winter the first of May! We will know it is Summer when the gates to the East Shore Express open at the Old Elementary School.

Speaking of that subject, there was finally a face-



to-face meeting last week between the residents of Incline and the Tahoe Transportation District (TTD). There was a nice

turnout of about 100 people, and about 20 people got up and spoke their mind, including yours truly.

As I'm sure that you are all aware, the Old Elementary School was sold by the Washoe County School District to the TTD for the purpose of turning it into a "Bus Hub." I happen to live across the street from this site and have endured this nightmare for several years with the noise, dust and traffic, and it would only get worse if they actually make the site a "Bus Hub" We cannot allow them to continue at this site.

There are other means of transportation in our village for residents to get from place to place. This was one of the things that they tried to convince us would be a good use of the bus hub. There is the TART CONNECT which will pick you up at your residence and take you to your destination within the village for FREE. It is a very simple way of letting someone else do the driving. You can put the Application on your phone and they are usually at your home within 10 minutes. I have used it a few times when the weather was not very good and it was a success. There is also the TART bus that goes around the West and North side of the Lake and is also FREE. Remember that the East Shore Express only goes to Sand Harbor. For the most part is it only for

people coming into Incline from Reno, Carson City and the Bay Area. Most of us that have been talking about this for some time feel that this parking area for the "Bus Hub" should not be here in Incline at all, it should be someplace NOT in a residential neighborhood.

It was interesting that after the meeting, the people representing the TTD were overheard saying that they were surprised that there was so much pushback from the residents on this subject. I only hope that they will rethink this location for the "Bus Hub" which is in our front and back yard.

I hope this is food for thought for both our members and for TTD.

## **Election Integrity**

I have been informed by our Election Integrity Committee Chair that the Washoe County



Board of County Commissioners (BOC) is going to be voting AGAIN on hiring the leftist Election Group to "help" with our elections here in Washoe County. This measure was voted on and defeated at a previous BOC meeting but the powers that be are still pushing to hire this group. Noah Praetz and Jennifer Morrell are the founders of the Election Group.

"Jennifer Morrell and 'The Elections Group'are in the middle of the Democrats' 2020 Election plans. Morrell was involved before the election, during the election, and now after the 2020 Election. If Morrell is there, you better guard the ballots – Morrell is **also** a consultant for the Democracy Fund, which is eBay founder Pierre Omidyar's foundation. His foundation was a heavy donor to Zuckerbucks and the Democracy Fund is a main funder of much of the election BS that went on in 2020."

## The Sovietization of American Life

ehind all our disasters there looms an ideology, a creed that ignores cause and effect in the real world – without a shred of concern for the damage done to those outside

the nomenklatura.

One day historians will look back at the period beginning with the COVID lockdowns of spring 2020 through the midterm elections of 2022 to understand how America for over two years lost its collective mind and turned into something unrecognizable and antithetical to its founding principles.

"Sovietization" is perhaps the best diagnosis of the pathology. It refers to the subordination of policy, expression, popular culture, and even thought to ideological mandates. Ultimately such regimentation destroys a state since dogma wars with and defeats meritocracy, creativity, and freedom.

The one-party state is Sovietized. Public policy is no longer empirical but subservient to green, diversity, equity, and inclusion dogmas — and detached from the reality of daily middle-class existence. Decline is ensured once ideology governs problem-solving rather than time-tested and successful policymaking.

In a similar fashion, the common denominator in Joe Biden's two years of colossal failures is Soviet-like edicts of equity, climate change, and neosocialist redistribution that have ensured (for the non-elite, in any event) soaring inflation, unaffordable energy, rampant crime, and catastrophic illegal immigration. Playing the role of *Pravda*, Biden and his team simply denied things were bad, relabeled failure as success, and attacked his predecessor and critics as various sorts of counterrevolutionaries.


Biden rejected commonsense, bipartisan policies that in the past kept inflation low, energy affordable, crime controlled, and the border manageable. Instead, he superimposed leftist dogma on every decision, whose ideological purity, not real-life consequences for millions, was considered the measure of success.

"Diversity," "equity," and "inclusion" started out as mandated proportional representation as defined by the state allotting spoils of coveted admissions, hiring, honors, and career advancement by race and gender percentages in the general population. The subtext was that federal and state governments imported and incorporated largely academic theories that alleged any disequilibrium was due to bias.

More specifically, racial and sexual prejudices were to be exposed and punished by morally superior castes—in politics, the bureaucracy, and the courts. There was never any interest in detailing how particular individuals were personally harmed by the system or by the "other," which explains the Left's abhorrence of racially blind, class-based criteria to establish justified need.

Where does woke Sovietization end once accountability vanishes and ideology masks incompetence and malfeasance? Behind all our disasters there looms an ideology, a creed that ignores cause and effect in the real world – without a shred of concern for the damage done to those outside the nomenklatura.

UPDATE ON BORDER CRISIS – President Joe Biden vows that on May 11 he'll end the use of Title 42 to turn away migrants. Yet he has no plans to deal with the flood of newcomers the move will unleash — with as many as 40,000 now already massed on the Mexican side, alarming officials. In January, recall, they rolled out a supposedly major shift to stem the tide, letting officials deny immigrants from Venezuela, Nicaragua, Cuba and Haiti the chance to apply for asylum if they crossed the border illegally. Yet 30,000 of those migrants (360,000 a year) would be allowed to migrate here if they met certain criteria. And even those denied represent only a fraction of the migrants. Nonetheless, migrant encounters topped 212,000 in February (the month after the announcement) — 11%

more than February 2022 and four times as much as Donald Trump's last February as president. This month, Team Biden said it would increase use of a decades-old law that has asylum-seekers interviewed at the border. Yet they admit that would affect only a small number of migrants. And most would likely be allowed to remain anyway, no matter how weak their asylum claims. Indeed, the president's commitment to lefty views on migrants' rights leaves his enforcement choices hopelessly limited. Let's be honest: Biden doesn't give a damn about border enforcement. *Source: nypost 4-15-23*.
