

Abortion Politics – Democracy Vindicates Alito on Abortion

It isn't exactly a national consensus, which in any case is an oxymoron, but in the year since the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade the beginnings of a broad political settlement have emerged.

"We do not pretend to know how our political system or society will respond," Justice Samuel Alito wrote last June, "We can only do our job, which is to interpret the law." The ruling created a political furor, but events are vindicating the Court's majority. At Gallup's survey data posted last week, Americans say abortion should be generally legal during the first three months of pregnancy, 69 percent to 24 percent. But for the second three months the majority flips: 55 percent say illegal, and only 37 percent say legal. Among women 52 percent oppose legal abortion in the second three months, while 40 percent support it.

"Abortion presents a profound moral question," wrote Justice Alito. "The Constitution does not prohibit the citizens of each State from regulating or prohibiting abortion. We now overrule those decisions and return that authority to the people and their elected representatives."

This isn't a partisan sentiment. It's a recognition that the U.S. Constitution created a federal republic in which the most contentious issues are best settled by voters and their delegates. For almost 50 years Roe denied Americans an honest debate. Now abortion is back in the people's hands – where it belonged all along.



The Reset Riddle

hroughout the pandemic and beyond, you've likely heard top political figures and Big Tech leaders talking about the opportunity to "reset" and "build back better." Founder and executive chairman of the World

Economic Forum (WEF) Klaus Schwab is often said to be the mastermind behind this and is credited with circulating the idea of The Great Reset, of which "build back better" is an integral part. However, there are other nefarious players who may have even more power, namely the newly crowned King Charles III. "When The Great Reset was officially launched in 2020, it was not done so by Klaus Schwab or Bill Gates, but by Charles, Prince of Wales, then heir-apparent to the British throne," according to Winter Oak, an independent not-for-profit organization "with a serious aversion to the global mafia's 'development' agenda and a commitment to truth, freedom and social justice."

They've outlined key details on why King Charles should be on your radar when it comes to the implantation of The Great Reset and Agenda 21 (Agenda for the 21st Century) — the inventory and control plan for all land, water, minerals, plants, animals, construction, means of production, food, energy, information, education and all human beings in the world.

Is King Charles 'The Great Resetter'?

In June 2020, King Charles, then The Prince of Wales, announced he was launching a "new global initiative, The Great Reset," along with WEF's and His Royal Highness' Sustainable Markets Initiative. A tweet from Clarence House stated:

"#TheGreatReset initiative is designed to ensure businesses and communities 'build back better' by putting sustainable business practices at the heart of their operations as they begin to recover from the coronavirus pandemic."

Winter Oak explained . . . "This may come as a bit of a surprise to those who see Charles as a bumbling but affable figure, who talks to his plants, loves traditional architecture, protects nature and tries to help young people get along in life. But the reality . . . is that he is the head (or the very willing figurehead) of a vast empire of nefarious financial interests hiding hypocritically behind a facade of charitable philanthropy."

King Charles' charitable enterprise spans a "global web of trusts, foundations and funds," as well as the Business in the Community organization in the U.K. This business-led membership organization if very much aligned with the Great Reset, declaring businesses meet the United Nations' Global Goals or the Sustainable Development Goals [SDGs].

Sustainability is a key tenet throughout The Great Reset. But while the notion of a "sustainable" pollution-free world is an attractive one, ultimately this isn't about the environment.

Instead, it's all about creating a control system in which the world's resources are owned by the richest of the rich, while the rest of the population can be controlled through the allocation of those resources, including energy.

As Robert Kennedy Jr. noted, "Climate issues and pollution issues are being exploited by the WEF and Bill Gates and all of these mega-billionaires the same way that COVID was exploited – to use it as an excuse to clamp down top-down totalitarian controls"

Just like COVID-19 was used to accelerate globalists' control, war and other societal upheavals also push forward the agenda. As explained in a 2022 Winter Oak article:

"Under such an economic construct, asset holding conglomerates can redirect the flow of global

capital by aligning investments with the UN's SDGs and configuring them as Environmental, Social, and Corporate Governance (ESG) compliant so that new international markets can be built on the disaster and misery of potentially hundreds of millions of people reeling from the economic collapse caused by war.

"Therefore, the war offers a huge impetus for the governments pushing the reset to actively pursue energy independence, shape markets towards 'green and inclusive growth' and eventually move populations towards a cap-and-trade system, otherwise known as a carbon credit economy.

"This will centralize power in the hands of stakeholder capitalists under the benevolent guise of reinventing capitalism through fairer and greener means, using deceptive slogans like 'Build Back Better' without sacrificing the perpetual growth imperative of capitalism."

A Digital Revolution Is Coming

Business in the Community has also been embracing the digital revolution since at least 2017, much like WEF, which supports the "merging of man and machine," or transhumanism. Its Fourth Industrial Revolution aims to use wearable and implantable technology to surveil your thoughts and launch a digital dictatorship that, once implemented, will be

almost impossible to escape from.

In 2017, Business in the Community – The Prince's Responsible Business Network – revealed its report, "A Brave New

World? Priorities and Actions for an Inclusive Digital Revolution," which "features all the

familiar Great Reset 'priorities.'" The Prince's Trust Group has been expanding this agenda across the Commonwealth, which was formerly known as the British Empire.

SB163: The Most Explosive Bill of 2023 Nevada Legislature

fter extensive research on SB163, the bill providing medical coverage for certain transgender medical services, I believe it requires some historical political perspective for those who are relative newcomers to Nevada. Over the past 25 years, our state has changed. A LOT.

When I got actively involved full-time as the Clark County GOP chairman in 1995, Las Vegas was exploding...literally. One after another, a Strip hotel was blown up to make way for brandspanking new resorts.

In addition, there was a housing boom to accommodate all the people moving here, especially "missionaries," not "refugees," from California. But thanks to frontier and rural counties, we were still a "purple" swing state.

Then in 1998, things started to turn "red." Republicans won 5 out of 6 of the statewide constitutional offices. Democrats controlled the State Assembly, but Republicans controlled the State Senate.

For the next 16 years, a Republican sat in the governor's office, Democrats continued to hold the Assembly, and both parties switched back and forth for control of the Senate.

Then 2014 came along. Thanks to a REAL "red wave" – the Democrat candidate for governor actually lost his primary to "None of the Above"!

- Republicans ended up controlling all 6 of the statewide offices, as well as the Senate and Assembly.

If ever there was a chance to change the GOP's political prospects for years to come, this was it. But as you know, Republicans never blow an opportunity to blow an opportunity.

Republican Gov. Brian Sandoval, Republican Senate Majority Leader "Tax Hike Mike" Roberson and Republican Assembly Speaker John Hambrick proceeded to pass the largest tax hike in state history, failed to redraw legislative district lines, and refused to properly fund Education Savings Accounts (ESAs) after the Nevada Supreme Court ruled they were legal.

Those failures resulted in Democrats winning back

control of both houses of the Legislature in 2016 and getting a Democrat elected governor for the first time in 20 in the 2018 GOP wipeout. They also won 3 out of 4 congressional seats, as well as



both U.S. Senate seats.

And they used their power to redraw district lines following the 2020 Census to better protect all of them.

Today, if we're not a blue state, we're at least deep purple. And the results of last year's elections show where the GOP needs to be in this new political reality.

The "MAGA" and "Tea Party" Republicans – falsely predicting a red wave and spouting

undocumented and unproven election fraud conspiracy theories – went down in flames.

Democrats increased their majorities in both the Senate and Assembly. In fact, they gained a supermajority in the Assembly and fell just one seat short of a super-majority in the Senate.

The only real bright spot for Republicans was Joe Lombardo kicking Steve Sisolak – the Master of COVID Disaster – out of the governor's office. In fact, he was the only Republican to oust an incumbent Democrat governor anywhere in the U.S. He did so by campaigning and being who he is.

Make no mistake, Lombardo's no movement conservative like many of us – and never pretended to be so (like Sandoval did). He's a pragmatic chief executive focused on, in his own words, "getting sh*t done."

But through the lens of conservative principles. Here's one example...

As Clark County sheriff, Lombardo had to make a tough decision when it came to dealing with illegal aliens who had been arrested. He was facing an expensive lawsuit if he continued what was called the "287(g)" notification partnership with ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) – a lawsuit that would have been a crapshoot, at best, if it went to court.

Instead, Lombardo found a work-around. He quietly had METRO call ICE before an illegal alien criminal was released from jail so ICE could be on the doorstep to pick 'em up when they came out the door rather than directly handing them over.

Getting sh*t done!

In his inaugural State of State Address back in January, Lombardo detailed his legislative policy agenda that included a LOT of what conservatives were looking for. School choice, a crackdown on crime, election reforms making it harder to cheat, etc.

However, Lombardo was also the only GOP governor in the country saddled with a Democrat-controlled Legislature – and an extreme, and extremely hostile, one at that.

In addition, the ragtag team of Republican legislators he went into the fight with included a bunch of freshmen who didn't even know where the bathrooms were, as well as a number of wishywashy squishes who tucked tail and ran whenever a Democrat said "boo" to them.

Anyone who thought Gov. Lombardo could enact conservative policies like governors in states such as Florida and Texas – who enjoy the luxury of having Republican-controlled Legislatures - was politically ignorant or hopelessly naïve.

But now's not the time to talk about *Las Vegas Review-Journal* columnist Victor Joecks.

When the smoke cleared after the end of the session, Lombardo – the only thing standing between us and the total californication of Nevada - DID get much of his policy agenda through - though in some cases, parts were watered down.

But the BIGGIE, expanding school choice Opportunity Scholarships, wasn't one of them. At the orders of the teachers' unions, Democrats dug their heels in and made cutting funding for Opportunity Scholarships, rather than increasing it, their "hill to die for."

School choice advocates were understandably disappointed. But remember, Lombardo is a pragmatic chief executive who knows there are more ways to skin a cat and get sh*t done.

So he's already taking steps to replace the money Democrats took from the Opportunity Scholarship program – which mostly benefits low-income, minority families – with private money from other sources.


In addition, the Democrats dumped a ton of bad bills on the governor's desk that Republicans were unable or unwilling to kill in the Legislature.

In return, Lombardo shattered the previous singlesession veto record of 48, set by conservative former Gov. Jim Gibbons, by rejecting 75 bills.


But remember, those 75 crappy bills could still become law!

If Democrats hold their super-majority in the Assembly and pick up just one seat in the Senate – a very real possibility – the Democrats will have enough votes to override all 75 of those vetoes when the 2025 session of the Nevada Legislature is convened.

So Republicans need to keep Nevada's long-term, big-picture political reality in mind when assessing how and why the governor signed, rather than vetoed, the most explosive bill of the 2023 session...SB163.

- You are the last to see the gold stars in the front windows of grieving neighbors whose sons died in the War.
- You are the last generation who spent childhood without television; instead you

imagined what you heard on the radio and read library books. The lack of TV in your early years meant you had little real understanding of what the world was like. On Saturday mornings and afternoons the movies gave you newsreels sandwiched in between westerns and cartoons. With no TV until the 1950s you spent your childhood "playing outside" (often until the street lights came on).

- There were no Little Leagues and many kids walked to school. There were no city playgrounds and you organized neighborhood baseball and football games on vacant lots. You rode your bike everywhere.
- Newspapers and magazines were written for adults and the news was broadcast on your radio in the evening. Kids read comic books.
- The "technology of the day" -- There were

telephones, one to a house, often shared (party lines, no cares about privacy). Computers were called calculations and were hand cranked. Typewriters were driven by pounding fingers, throwing the carriage, and changing the ribbon. Internet and



GOOGLE were words that did not exist.
