

Gordon Chang Sounds the Alarm



ost Americans alive today were born after World War II, so they have no experience or even memory of a time when another country, Hitler's Germany, actually went to war to conquer the world. Many Americans do not know that human history is a long, dreary chronicle of efforts by various empires to conquer other peoples, often including the entire world that was known to them at the time. So, many Americans -- most Americans? -- find it hard to believe that there is a country even now that has set about conquering the world. They find the very idea impossible to believe -- even absurd -- even a "conspiracy theory."

Gordon Chang, renowned expert on China, came to see the club last month to explain to us that there is a country -- China – whose government has a plan that they have thought out, written down and shared with the world not just to dominate, but to rule the world. China plans that by 2049, the 100th anniversary of the Chinese Revolution, it will be ruling the world. Gordon explained that the leadership of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) understands that to do this, it will have to eliminate the United States. He told us about a general high up in the Chinese military hierarchy who has explained that China is developing viruses and other diseases to which Chinese people would be immune, but that would be lethal to non-Chinese. Does this sound familiar to you? By now, pretty much everyone is aware of the Wuhan Institute of Virology that most observers believe created and spread the COVID-19 virus to the rest of the world -- the first time in history that one country has deliberately attacked all the other countries on the planet.

However, Gordon explained, this is far from the only way that the CCP is attacking America. The CCP is using one of the best qualities of our society, our openness and high level of trust, to attack and destroy us. It has effectively been at war with us for years using a multi-pronged attack. For example,

The CCP has infiltrated Academia with such programs as "Confucius Institutes" in universities and believe it or not – "Confucius Classrooms" in kindergarten through 12th grade education. Another example: The CCP has developed relationships with Mexican drug cartels, provides them with the ingredients to make fentanyl, and assists

them in smuggling it into the United States and in laundering the proceeds through the Chinese financial system. With the help of the Chinese government, drug cartels have already smuggled into the United States more than enough fentanyl to kill the entire population.

The bottom line is that the Chinese Communist party is an existential threat to the United States, to the current international order, and to human civilization. This is not a "conspiracy theory" and it is not an exaggeration!

Gordon Chang shared with us much of his enormous knowledge of China and of the Chinese government/CCP's goals and what it is doing to achieve them. His breadth of knowledge is so comprehensive that I can only convey a sliver of it by what I have written here. I urge you to do as I have done: **Pre-order his new book**, *Plan Red: China's Project to Destroy America*, that will be published on **October 1st**, from <u>Amazon.com</u>. Order the book, read it, and pass it on to a friend. Do what you can to spread the word!

We also had Gordon's presentation videotaped and will advise when and where we have posted it as soon as it is ready.





About JD Vance

n July 15, 2024 former President Donald Trump announced that Senator J.D. Vance (R-Ohio) was his vice presidential pick, ending months of speculation. "After lengthy deliberation and thought, and considering the tremendous talents of many others, I have decided that the person best suited to assume the position of Vice President of the United States is Senator J.D. Vance," Trump said in a Truth Social post.

r. Vance was born on August 2, 1984.
Turning 40 in August, he's the first millennial on a major party ticket and one of the youngest vice presidential candidates in history. Mr. Vance was raised Protestant, but later converted to Catholicism, officially becoming Catholic in August 2019.

Mr. Vance is married to Usha Chilukuri Vance, whom he met at Yale Law School. They married in 2014. Ms. Vance currently works as a corporate litigator. She has clerked for Supreme Court Chief Justice John Roberts and then-appellate Judge Brett Kavanaugh. She would be the first Hindu spouse of a vice president and the first person of color to be second lady. Usha and JD Vance have three children: Ewan, 7, Vivek, 4, and Mirabel, 2.

JD on Politics

JD Vance is commonly considered to be a populist conservative. His political ideology is often placed alongside the ranks of former President Trump, Sen. Josh Hawley (R-Mo.), and pro-Trump swaths of the House Freedom Caucus.

Years before being a staunch ally of former President Trump, Mr. Vance wrote an op-ed in *The New York Times* in which he called the former president "unfit for our nation's highest office." Since 2016, Mr. Vance said his views on the former president have changed, and he's recanted his statements. The reason for this, he said, was seeing how former President Trump handled the job. In a May interview with CNN, he told anchor Dana Bash, "I didn't think he was going to be a good president, Dana, and I was very, very proud to be proven wrong. It's one of the reasons why I'm working so hard to get him elected."

Mr. Vance has been in politics just over a year and a half, joining the Senate – his first political office – in January 2023. Since joining the Senate, Mr. Vance has regularly voted with the most conservative wing of the Senate Republican conference on an array of key issues, from foreign aid to government finance. The political arm of the conservative think tank the Heritage Foundation rates him as voting with conservative positions 93 percent of the time.

In the Senate he serves on the Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs Committee; the Commerce, Science, and Transportation Committee; and the Special Committee on Aging. In June 2023, Mr. Vance announced that he would use his power as a senator to place holds on all future nominees to the Department of Justice. He cited the department's prosecutions against the former president as the reason for the hold.

Mr. Vance indicated he supports leaving abortion to the states.

Mr. Vance served in Iraq as a Marine combat correspondent during the mid-2000s. Though he served in the Iraq War as a Marine, he has since been critical of the conflict, saying he regrets supporting it. "I served my country honorably, and I saw when I went to Iraq that I had been lied to, that the promises of the foreign policy establishment of this country were a complete joke," he said on the Senate floor this year in April.

Mr. Vance is also critical of continued U.S. support for the war in Ukraine. Since taking office, he's voted against every Ukraine aid package that's come to the floor. He's called for Europe to bear the brunt of financing the war. Mr. Vance wrote in an April op-ed for *The New York Times* that the current trajectory of the war is unsustainable for either the U.S. or Ukraine.


Mr. Vance supports aid to Israel. In a May 2024 speech at the Quincy Institute, Mr. Vance gave a contrast between supporting Israel and Ukraine. With Ukraine, he said, there's "no strategic end in sight" and that the Europeans are not doing their fair share. But Israel, he said, is "doing the most important work to give us missile-defense parity." He also opposed the 2015 Iran nuclear deal and applauded President Trump for withdrawing from it in 2018.

JD has taken a tough stance on China. Between the wars in Ukraine, Israel, and Taiwan, Mr. Vance said that we should be focused on our own problems and that's mostly China. He thinks the Chinese are focused on real power and their government is focused on how strong the United States actually is and it's ability to push back against them. "We've got to focus there, and right now, we're stretched too thin," he emphasized.

JD's Childhood and Growing-up Years

Mr. Vance grew up in a lower-class family in Middletown, Ohio, and often experienced financial and familial hardships. Mr. Vance became well-known for his best-selling memoir, *Hillbilly Elegy*,

published in 2016. He details his time growing up in poverty-stricken areas of the Rust Belt and the book traces the drug abuse issues and financial hardships experienced by many in the white working class. Mr. Vance's book was adapted



into a namesake Netflix film in 2020.

In both his memoir and the movie adaptation, Mr. Vance explains his experience of the decline of the Rust Belt and the impacts it had on those living there. Speaking about his native Middletown, Mr. Vance wrote in *Hillbilly Elegy*, "There is a lack of agency here – a feeling that you have little control over your life and a willingness to blame everyone but yourself." He says that some of these experiences have continued to shape his political life and decisions

Despite growing up in Ohio, Mr. Vance said he considered his great-grandmother's house in rural Kentucky as home. "My address was where I spent most of my time with my mother and sister, wherever that might be. But my home never changed: my great-grandmother's house, in the holler, in Jackson, Kentucky."

Mr. Vance's parents, Donald Bowman and Bev Vance, divorced when he was very young, leaving him to be raised by his mother. His father is described as having been largely absent from JD's life although they connected later in life. At birth, JD Vance was named James Donald Bowman. Years later he temporarily took on his stepfather's surname, Hamel. He eventually settled on Vance, which belonged to his mother and grandparents.

In his book JD recounts in detail his mother's struggles with opioid addiction, including heroin. The struggles of home life, compounded by his mother's struggles with drug addiction, eventually led to Mr. Vance living with his grandmother. His grandparents, James "Papaw" Vance and Bonnie "Mamaw" Vance, moved to Kentucky, unmarried

and with child, in the 1940s, but ultimately divorced. They remained on good terms. In his memoir, Mr. Vance credits his time living with his grandmother while he was in high school with helping him to commit to his studies and, ultimately, escape the poverty he grew up in.

JD Vance's Education

Mr. Vance has a dual undergraduate degree in political science and philosophy from Ohio State University. He graduated summa cum laude in 2009. He earned a juris doctorate from Yale Law School in 2013. While studying law, Mr. Vance served on the editorial staff of the Yale Law Journal.

After graduating from Yale Law School, Mr. Vance worked at the law firm Sidley Austin LLP before joining billionaire Peter Thiel's Mithril Capital in San Francisco. Mr. Thiel later spent more than \$10 million in support of Mr. Vance during his 2022 Senate run. JD started an Ohio-based company called Narya, which he describes as "an early-stage venture capital firm focused on using technology and science to solve for the future."

JD Vance's Marine Corps Service Would Set Him Apart from Most Vice Presidents

The following is an excerpt from Hillbilly Elegy, Vance's memoir about growing up in



Appalachian culture, his Marine Corps service, and his eventual studies at Yale Law School. Vance offers clear-eyed and powerful testimony about the gaps in American society, told from the perspective of a guy who's experienced both sides of the divide.

y final two years in the Marines flew by and were largely uneventful, though two incidents stand out, each of which speaks to the way the Marine Corps changed my perspective. The first was a moment in time in Iraq, where I was lucky to escape any real fighting but which affected me deeply nonetheless. As a public affairs marine, I would attach to different units to get a sense of their daily routine. Sometimes I'd escort civilian press, but generally I'd take photos or write short stories about individual marines or their work. Early in my deployment, I attached to a civil affairs unit to do community outreach. Civil affairs missions were typically considered more dangerous, as a small number of marines would venture into unprotected Iragi territory to meet with locals. On our particular mission, senior marines met with local school officials while the rest of us provided security or hung out with the schoolkids, playing soccer and passing out candy and school supplies. One very shy boy approached me and held out his hand. When I gave him a small eraser, his face briefly lit up with joy before he ran away to his family, holding his two-cent prize aloft in triumph. I have never seen such excitement on a child's face.

I don't believe in epiphanies. I don't believe in transformative moments, as transformation is harder than a moment. I've seen far too many people awash in a genuine desire to change only to lose their mettle when they realized just how difficult change actually is. But that moment, with that boy, was pretty close for me. For my entire life, I'd harbored resentment at the world. I was mad at my mother and father. mad that I rode the bus to school while other kids caught rides with friends, mad that my clothes didn't come from Abercrombie, mad that my grandfather died, mad that we lived in a small house. That resentment didn't vanish in an instant, but as I stood and surveyed the mass of children of a war-torn nation, their school without running water, and the overjoyed boy, I began to appreciate how lucky I was: born in the greatest country on earth, every modern convenience at my fingertips, supported by two loving hillbillies, and part of a family that, for all its quirks, loved me unconditionally. At that moment, I resolved to be the type of man who would smile when someone gave him an eraser. I haven't quite made it there, but without that day in Iraq, I wouldn't be trying. . .




Chart that former President Trump turned to show his audience before he was shot.
