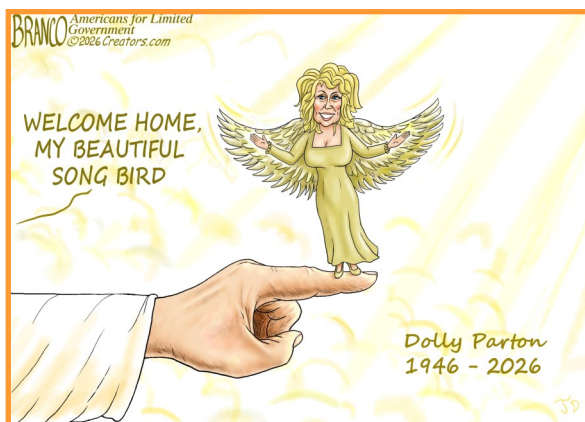

AUGUST UPDATE REPORT for the Incline Village General Improvement District

TREE POISONING AT BURNT CEDAR BEACH

The recent tree vandalism at Burnt Cedar could very likely have been prevented. When the new Board took office in 2025, Karen Crocker was serving as Director of Parks and Recreation. Her presentation at the Board's budget workshop on 3/12/2025 highlighted an \$18,000 capital budget item for cameras at Burnt Cedar Beach. She confirmed that this money was needed in response to previous vandalism of trees in the same area where they were poisoned in late July.

The District already spent almost \$170,000 on a very high-end security system (Verkada) over the past 5 years, but somehow this item was not part of the budget year which just ended June 30. According to a public records request "The FY25-26 capital plan did not include any funding appropriations or budgeted capital projects for the installation of security cameras at Burnt Cedar..."

In February a well-intentioned Parks and Recreation employee purchased a pair of cheap "trail cameras." They were not designed for security use and proved grossly inadequate.

In light of the multiple tree poisonings, the General Manager announced plans to spend \$47,000 on additional cameras and monitoring to protect the area. No one provided an explanation as to why Mrs. Crocker's highlighted budget item from March 2025 was ignored.

SUSAN HERRON VS IVGID EMRB DECISION

The Nevada Government Employee-Management Relations Board found in favor of the District in Susan Herron's complaint claiming the District discriminated against her for political or personal reasons. She had asked for attorneys' fees and costs

as well as “other relief.” The panel determined her claims were unfounded.

WASTE MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT RENEWAL

FINANCIAL REPORTS

The Finance Director's unaudited financial reports for the fiscal year ending 6/30/26 showed the Community Services Fund's actual operating losses exceed \$2M dollars, once again requiring Facility Fees to be used to subsidize operations. Including depreciation, that figure is over \$5M. Even past auditors do not consider the Facility Fees as operating revenue so they were not included in these calculations. The Beach Fund barely broke even, with increased revenues from the sale of alcohol and Hyatt guest access fees. The IVGID “portfolio” requires our Facility Fees to subsidize its operations as well as cover all capital expenses.

TTD DISPOSAL OF OLD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PROPERTY

Public comment was made by TTD Board Chair, Andy Chapman concerning the future of the old elementary school property. In it he addressed several misconceptions in the content of the support letter from the IVGID Board to TTD. Only 8 out of 100 units would be the lowest income category. He also wanted to emphasize that if the property is sold, it must be sold to the highest bidder. There is no guarantee that it would be ISA. The winning bidder would be able to choose its use. While IVGID gave the ISA 15 minutes to speak about their proposal, Mr. Chapman was abruptly cut off by the Chair at 3 minutes.

COMING SOON

At the September 9, 2026 meeting, the Board will vote on the 30% Design Contract for the largest recreation capital project ever: the \$40M+ Snowflake Lodge/lift replacement project. As yet, there has been no participation suggested by members of the public. Public participation needs to happen now, not as it occurred with the Beach House where the public had no say in the major design elements.

Making America Great Again: The Wins Every Republican Woman Should Know

In a world where the news cycle seems to always focus on negative stories, this week I want us to focus on what is actually happening that is Making America Great Again. First, I want to admit that the genesis of this week's article is one written by Nick Arama, since I don't want to be guilty of plagiarizing! His article on August 27 outlined wins for America, and as we are getting ready to go into the fall campaigning season, it's really important for us to be armed with facts, and positive accomplishments of Republicans. Even though making a contrast between Republicans and Democrat far-left candidates is important, we have to also emphasize the good happening because Republicans are in charge.

One of the major issues in the 2016, 2020 and 2024 Presidential elections was illegal immigration and control of our border and sovereignty. The U.S. is targeting and removing temporary visa holders who have overstayed their visas. Just this week, the Trump administration announced that all appointments for visa applications have been paused, while training and vetting policies are implemented to deny visas to people intending harm to the United States, who espouse anti-American values, and people who will be dependent on assistance once in the United States. The Administration also increased the fee for H-1B Visas to \$103,000, which makes it much less affordable for companies to bring in foreign workers over American workers. Refundable tax

credits ("refunds" given to people who don't pay income taxes) were ended by the Trump Administration for illegal immigrants, something that had been costing taxpayers 3 billion dollars.

ICE is continuing to arrest illegal immigrants with criminal records, with July having the highest monthly total for President Trump's second term, and in early August, ICE arrested 1328 people here illegally who had been protected by sanctuary policies in the Washington DC suburbs. Finally, on the immigration front, immigrants here because of Obama and Biden "Temporary Protective Status" policies were deported back to their home countries when the Courts made it clear that "temporary" means "temporary."

In an area related to the wide-open border under Biden, fentanyl drug deaths have dropped 22 percent since Trump took office in January of 2025. This is because of the actions of the government in sealing the border, taking out cartels, arresting Maduro, and education and treatment efforts under Sara Carter, Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy.

There are also wins on the economic front. In Middletown Ohio, the steel plant there is doing a \$1 billion upgrade to preserve jobs and make steel more competitively. Amazon is building a multibillion-dollar robotics facility in Texas, which will create up to 500 manufacturing and technical jobs. Ford is expanding production of its Lincoln model in the U.S. adding thousands of jobs. Business activity in the U.S. is growing faster than it has in over four years. Stronger demand across the economy is creating more startups and expansion of existing businesses. Manufacturing activity is even soaring in places like Philadelphia.



Add all these wins to the growth-oriented tax policies in the Working Families Tax Cut Act and the economy is set to continue growing, bringing jobs and prosperity to American families. ***Thank you President***

**Assure Election Integrity: Pass the
Save Act or Declare a National
Security Emergency**

Conservative TV and radio host, Wayne Allyn Root says that President Trump needs to use the **National Security Emergency for Elections** by mid-September to assure citizen-only voting in the upcoming national midterm elections. Root explained the emergency decree to the President in a recent TV interview that aired on Real America's Voice. Since then he reported that the Democrats were outraged that the emergency decree might be used to stop any threats domestic and foreign that would hinder voting integrity.

What is the National Security Emergency for Elections? On September 12, 2018, by Executive Order 13848 a national emergency regarding foreign interference in U.S. elections was declared. This was done to address threats to national security and public confidence in elections by President Donald Trump.

The establishment of national security emergencies for elections in the U.S. was influenced by historical

events such as World War I, the Civil War, and the post-9/11 era, which highlighted the need for a framework to manage crises that could disrupt democratic processes. The National Emergencies Act of 1976 was specifically created to provide guidelines for how the federal government responds to such emergencies and was approved by the Supreme Court.

It doesn't look good for the SAVE Act to pass in the Senate. If not passed the President could choose to use the National Security Emergency for Elections which would mandate voter photo ID, proof of citizenship to vote, and limit mail-in voting. More importantly, Democrats cannot stop it with a legal challenge. A National Security Emergency declaration can only be stopped with a 2/3rds vote of both houses of Congress.

Revisiting Question 7 in Nevada - The Voter ID Initiative

Nevada voters will revisit Question 7 in 2026, the voter ID initiative that passed in a landslide with 73.23% approval in 2024. Because Question 7 changes Nevada's constitution, it needs to pass twice. It now requires a second "yes" vote this November. If approved again, it becomes part of Article 2 of the Nevada Constitution.

Question 7 would amend the constitution to require all in-person voters present a valid photo identification before voting. It lists eight approved forms of government-issued IDs, including driver's licenses, passports, student and tribal photo identification. It also permits the Nevada Legislature to approve additional government-issued IDs. In addition, it would require voters using a mail ballot to list the last four digits of their Nevada driver's license number or the last four digits of their Social Security number — alongside their signature.

Thirty-six states have some form of voter ID law with no major complaints. Nevada is one of only 14 states to not require a form of identification while voting, and instead relies on a voter signature to verify voter identity. Polls consistently show overwhelming support for voter ID.

A Pew Research survey last year found 83% of adults, and 71% of Democrats, favor it. CBS conducted a poll earlier this year and found that 80% support voter ID, a finding that transcends party lines. Earlier polls done by Gallup and Monmouth also measured 80% and 81% support for voter ID. A Nevada Independent poll in 2023 reported 74% of Nevada registered voters across all demographic groups support a voter ID requirement: 62% of Democrats, 93% of Republicans and 68% of independents/non-partisans.

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Revisiting Question 7

At the urging of voters, Governor Joe Lombardo made voter ID a campaign promise during his 2022 gubernatorial campaign. He introduced it as part of his proposed Election Integrity Act in 2023. Legislative Democrats failed to even consider the bill and described it as “dead on arrival.” Democrats have legislated a leaky election system to juice their votes.

As promised in his first State of the State address, Lombardo then went to the voters. This very popular initiative received 179,000 signatures across all seventeen Nevada counties, 80% above the legal requirement. It passed in 2024 with nearly three out of every four Nevada voters approving.

It's common-sense election reform. Most proponents of voter ID acknowledge there aren't millions of fake votes being cast in elections. The point of enacting voter ID is not that our system is hopelessly compromised but rather that it is needlessly vulnerable. Question 7 has faced significant challenges.

Chief legal strategist for the Democratic Party, Marc Elias, and a coalition of anti-voter ID groups sued in Nevada state court to stop the measure. Fortunately for Nevada voters, the Nevada Supreme Court ruled unanimously that the measure could proceed. However, the battle continues as opponents of Question 7 put out misinformation. Democrat opponents include nominees for governor (Aaron Ford), attorney general (Nicole Cannizzaro) and secretary of state (Cisco Aguilar). Hard-left activists resist voter ID as racist voter suppression. They claim it could disenfranchise people who don't have an acceptable form of ID.

It's proven to be nonsense. It's an everyday occurrence to show an ID. We need ID to drive a car, board a plane, cash a check, buy alcohol, rent or buy a home, apply for welfare or housing benefits. The racism canard was made against Georgia's photo ID law in 2021. Yet, Georgia's Secretary of

State reported that turnout in the 2022 general election set records after the law took effect with no evidence to support the charge the ID law reduced turnout among minorities.

Lombardo is confident voters will finish what they started by voting “yes” a second time. **THE BOTTOM LINE: Requiring a photo ID won't make it harder to vote. It will make it harder to cheat.**

POLITICS. The late Sen. Lindsey Graham's sister, Darline, was appointed to fill his seat earlier this summer after Lindsey's untimely death.

New Statue of Thomas Jefferson by sculptor George Lundeen has been added to the White House Rose Garden

On July 4, Colorado sculptor George Lundeen received a surprise voicemail from President Donald Trump thanking him for his bronze statue of Founding Father Thomas Jefferson. The 77-year-old artist Lundeen said he was not in his studio when the President called so left a message on his answering machine. The President said in the message: “Hi, George. It’s your favorite president, Donald Trump, and I just wanted to thank you. ... It looks really beautiful!” President Trump continued, “I’ll see it very shortly, but just from the picture, I can see it’s really incredible. And we have a wonderful place [for it] right in the Rose Garden, and I appreciate it.”



The life-size bronze statue depicting Jefferson seated on a bench with the Declaration of Independence and a feather quill had remained in Lundeen’s studio for nearly 25 years. It now stands in the White House Rose Garden as one of the new monuments Trump added to celebrate America’s 250th birthday.

The person behind the effort to deliver the statue to the president was Steve Barber, George Lundeen’s longtime friend and business partner based in Los Angeles. Barber helps raise funds, works with sculptors, and oversees the creation and installation of statues for the president and other major public projects. When Barber saw the sculpture in Lundeen’s studio, he felt it belonged at the White House and wanted to donate it as a gift. But getting the attention of White House officials proved far more difficult than he expected.

Barber spent seven or eight months making nearly 100 phone calls and sending countless emails to the White House and other officials to get approval. After no response, he decided to give up the idea. Then something unexpected happened . . . “As soon as I let go, like the second I let go, I got an email from the White House,” Barber said. The message asked when he could send the sculpture.

On July 27, 2026 from his home in Venice Beach, California, Steven Barber prepared to deliver the Thomas Jefferson statue to President Donald Trump. The 585-pound sculpture was shipped to Washington a few weeks later, with hopes that it could be installed in the Rose Garden before the Independence Day celebrations. However, getting it to the White House was another challenge. A heat wave, road closures, and heightened security measures around the National Mall all delayed its arrival. The Secret Service also needed to complete a security screening. Lundeen joked that officials had to make sure no one was “sending a Trojan horse in the shape of Thomas Jefferson.”

Nearly a week after Independence Day, Lundeen and Barber received a photo from the White House showing the statue installed in the Rose Garden. The new piece now stands alongside four others installed in the Rose Garden: statues of George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, and Alexander Hamilton and a sculpture called “Freedom’s Charge” depicting two life-size Revolutionary War soldiers.
